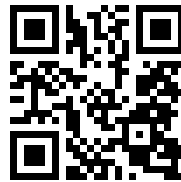

**Charlotte Olsen, Family Studies Professor and Extension Specialist, KSU**

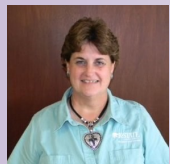

Dr. Yelland is an assistant professor and extension specialist in adult development in aging at Kansas State University. She is a Certified Family Life Educator (CFLE) and holds a graduate certificate in gerontology from the University of Kentucky. She has expertise in various community education initiatives such as Alzheimer's disease, fall prevention, keys to embracing aging, advance healthcare planning, and adult sexuality.

Are you considering what you should include in your estate plan and what methods you should use? A will? A trust? This session will help you understand how probate works, what a trust is, and review methods for protecting your assets.

**B. Long Term Planning: How to Prepare for the Possibility of Long Term Care, Randy Clinkscales**

This session will discuss how to protect your assets and pay for long term care without selling your home or leaving your family without a dime. It will also cover the estate planning documents that are essential to protect yourself and your family.

**C. Estate Planning Basics: Wills, Power of Attorney, & Health Care Agents, Anna Schremmer & Erin Yelland**

Estate Planning can be an intimidating process to begin regardless of how much you know. This session will cover how to get started, basic terms and to dos of estate planning. This presentation will also describe the difference between will, living trust, and living will and durable power of attorney for healthcare, financial durable power of attorney, and financial durable power of attorney with a focus on advance healthcare planning documents.

**D. Farm Succession Planning, Gregg Hadley**

Farm succession planning can be a scary topic for some farm and ranch families. This presentation and discussion will help demystify succession planning by discussing critical succession issues and recommending a farm succession process to follow.
