Dear Mission Participant,

Every day, in so many ways the Lord is calling out to each of us. He is constantly calling us to build God's kingdom of mercy and justice for all. Jesus had a clear preference for the poor. “What you do for the least among you, you do for me.” (Matthew 25:40)

Thank you for opening your heart to God's call to serve the poorest of the poor in the world as part of Mission Possible. Your “yes” to the Lord will make a real difference in the lives of those we serve. The experience will shape and form your heart and your life. This information packet is designed to give you good information and give you an opportunity to reflect on God's call and your response.

Please review the information below prior to filling out the attached paperwork.

For your information, Mission Possible Dominican Republic, Inc. is a formally recognized 501(c)3 organization. Since December of 2006 there have been nine mission trips of lay people and four trips of skilled tradesmen traveling to Higuey, Dominican Republic to care for the poorest of the poor and lift up a community of displaced Dominicans and Haitian refugees.

The goal of Mission Possible is to create a sense of solidarity – a real and meaningful relationship between our community at home and those we serve. Our hope is to create a personal connection between each missionary and the families we care for and serve. Simply put, our goals are to:

- **Care** for the poorest of the poor throughout the world
- **Connect** the People of God to Christ and his mission of service to the poor
- **Engage** the next generation to take on the work of Christ forever
- **Organize** and facilitate mission trips

As an interested and potential participant of Mission Possible, there are expectations for which each individual shall be held responsible. In best interest of the Mission, it is good to keep in mind there are two critical parts to the goals of Mission Possible:

- **Experience:** It is our goal to make your week in the Dominican incredible, awe-inspiring and life-changing.
- **Help the poorest of the poor:** It is also our goal to lift up our community in Higuey and continue to improve their lives by offering education, health care, housing, love and most importantly, hope for a better day.

In light of increased interest and to best achieve the goals of Mission Possible, several new factors will be taken into account when considering participants:

- Cooperation and compliance of all pre-trip requirements, including, but not limited to:
 - Completion of ALL required forms, including a 3 paragraph response to the question “Why do you want to go on this mission trip?”
 - Virtus requirements (as specified by the Diocese of Cleveland)
 - Financial commitment (payments in time specified)
 - Attendance and Participation in pre-trip meetings and retreats
 - Participation in trip fundraisers
 - Demonstration of being a responsible, trustworthy individual
- Post-trip expectations
 - Participation in post-trip activities including:
 - A post-trip retreat
 - Fundraisers occurring throughout the year
 - A 1 year commitment to serve on the Working Board (meetings are quarterly).
- If you are a “returning mission member,” your eligibility for the trip will be based on past cooperation and commitment.

Dominican Republic Mission Trip

Dates: Friday, June 24 – Friday, July 1, 2011

Location: Higüey, Dominican Republic

Airport: Punta Cana

Lodging: Hotel Don Carlos in Higüey

Who can go: Anyone over 15 years old.



Cost:

- Total Personal Cost is **\$1,300** per person. This final cost includes the following:
 - Deposit: \$600 (due with registration)
 - 2nd Payment: \$400 (due by April 15, 2011)
 - 3rd Payment \$300 (due by May 12, 2011)

The third payment of \$300 is used for construction materials and other necessary supplies. You can certainly procure support by requesting financial assistance from family and friends (see page XXXX) as well as actively participating in Mission Trip fundraisers and meetings.

Additional requirements:

- **Passport**
 - Passports take several months to be processed. In order to expedite the process (receive a passport in 6 – 8 weeks), there is an additional \$60 fee.
 - Visit http://travel.state.gov/passport/fri/pubs/pubs_854.html for all necessary details.
 - The post office also has the forms needed to obtain a passport. For more info, go to <http://www.usps.com/passport/>.
 - Fees are \$110 if you are over 16 and \$80 if you are under 16. You will also have a \$25.00 execution fee to be paid to the facility where you are applying for your passport.
- **3 Copies of your health insurance card and passport (must be legible)**
- **Immunizations:** (available from the County Health Department)
Please make arrangements to visit one of the following Health Departments minimally 10 weeks prior to the trip.
 - Medina County Health Dept. (330-723-9688), Cuyahoga County Travel Clinic (216-201-2041)
 - Necessary immunizations and medications include: Hepatitis A & B, Tetanus, Typhoid, and Malaria pills
- **If you are over 18, you must be Virtus trained (www.virtus.org)**

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Where do we stay?

A. We stay at Hotel Don Carlos, centrally located near the cathedral in Higuey. It generally takes about twenty minutes by taxi to the work site.

Q. Is the hotel comfortable?

A. Our hotel is clean, safe and comfortable. While it is not up to the standards we look for in our nicer American facilities, it does have running water (not necessarily hot) to shower, air conditioning, electricity and television (fuzzy and a few stations).

Q. What is the temperature this time of year?

A. It is in the high 90's with high humidity.

Q. What will we be doing?

A. While we would love to have every detail listed in advance, the reality is that we work in a third world country and are constantly adapting and changing. During this trip we plan to build model homes and finalize the new building as well as complete a few other projects.

Q. What do we bring?

A. See attached Packing List.

Q. I don't speak Spanish. Is this a problem?

A. No. There are missionaries who are able to communicate in Spanish in order to efficiently and effectively accomplish the goals of the trip. Despite the language barrier, the local people are extremely kind and will often use gestures and hand motions to communicate.

Q. I'm not that strong nor physically fit. Is this OK?

A. Yes. Everyone has his/her own unique gifts and talents. Some may be good at pouring cement, some at painting, some at carpentry, some at electrical work, and some at sorting, organizing and distributing clothes. The important thing is to recognize your God-given talents and use these talents to help the poorest of the poor.

Q. I'm concerned about the intense heat of the day and ensuring my safety and health.

A. Hydration is essential! Don't try to be a hero. If you don't feel well, tell someone, take a break and get out of the heat. We also travel with several missionaries certified in CPR and first aid. There is a first aid kit on hand at all times.

Q. Is there a hospital or healthcare available?

A. Yes. There is an out-patient center about ten minutes from the hotel and twenty minutes from the worksite.

Q. What will we eat and drink?

A. We have developed a network of places and food sources that are both nutritious and safe. Lunch each day includes: peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, french fries, fruit and snacks (granola bars). Dinners may include: spaghetti, rice and beans, chicken, steak, or pizza. Be assured that you will be fed enjoyable food.

With your cooperation and compliance, we will accomplish our most important goal – safety and health!

Packing List

I/we agree by my/our mutual signature(s) to release, absolve, indemnify, and hold harmless any and all Catholic parishes, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Cleveland, the Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Cleveland, and any and all supervisors, volunteers, organizers or sponsors thereof, and from any and all liability for injury, medical fees, hospital bills, or doctor bills of aforesaid participant. I/we waive all claims of any kind against any or all of the organizations or persons hereinabove enumerated.

I/we understand that the program includes construction work, including but not limited to concrete and mortar work, moving equipment, laying blocks, constructing floors, walls, and roofs, painting, and other finishing work (hereinafter "volunteer effort"). I/we understand that this volunteer effort entails a risk of physical and/or mental and/or emotional injury and often involves hard physical labor, heavy lifting, and other strenuous activity. I/we have been advised that participants should wear appropriate work clothing including close-toed shoes to avoid possible injuries and work clothes appropriate to sometimes filthy working conditions. I/we understand the risks involved in the volunteer effort including injury, illness, and allergic reactions. I/we affirm that the participant herein named is in good health and physically and emotionally able to perform the foregoing volunteer effort. I/we waive all claims of any kind involving program activities against any or all of the organizations or persons herein above enumerated.

I/we understand that participation in this trip includes all of the risks of traveling to a foreign country. I/we have been advised of the recommended vaccinations, including hepatitis A and B, typhoid, tetanus, and malaria pills. I/we have also been advised of precautions necessary to avoid contracting any of these diseases, including drinking only bottled water and only fully cooked or otherwise safely prepared food. I/we waive all claims of any kind resulting from the contraction of any disease while in the Dominican Republic against any or all of the organizations or persons hereinabove enumerated.

I/we understand that travel between Cleveland, Ohio and the Dominican Republic will take place by airplane. I/we waive all claims of any kind involving travel against any or all of the organizations or persons hereinabove enumerated. I/we understand that participants will be housed in a simple retreat center in Higüey, Dominican Republic, selected by the trip organizers. The participants herein named will abide by whatever regulations may be in effect for the accommodations at the time. I/we waive all claims of any kind involving participant accommodations or feeding against any or all of the organizations or persons hereinabove enumerated.

I/we hereby give consent to photograph or videotape aforesaid participant and without limitation to use such photographs or videotapes and or stories in connection with any work of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Cleveland without consideration of any kind, and I do hereby release the organization hereinabove enumerated from any claims whatsoever which may arise in said regard.

Personal Fundraising

Sample Fundraising Letter

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Wonderfully Supportive,

Five years ago, our parish community heard about a small, impoverished village in the Dominican Republic that was in desperate need for our help. Answering the Gospel's call to love neighbors, wherever they may be, 35 missionaries traveled to Higuey. On this trip, they began a beautiful ministry to a village that had been devastated by Hurricane Jeanne.

In the past five years, eight other groups have traveled down to continue to help our brothers and sisters in Higuey, Dominican Republic. They have built a community center, provided water and electricity and opened a school. This school has provided the opportunity for over 300 children to finally receive the education they need to break the cycle of poverty.

What humbly began as one small mission trip has blossomed into an ongoing relationship with the beautiful people in this village. Having the opportunity to meet them, develop relationships and continue to be of service to them has been life changing and faith shaping for all who have had the privilege to travel there.

I am part of the next group that will journey to the Dominican Republic this June to continue the wonderful work begun there five years ago – the necessary work that continues today. Few among our many goals are to begin building model homes, finalize construction on a vocational center and reach out to the poorest of the poor in love and support.

Each mission trip has not just been about the American missionaries, but about the entire community of family, friends and fellow parishioners that have helped to make them a reality. With each trip we have been able to bring more tools, medical supplies, clothes and toys. We need your help. Will YOU join us as we reach out to those less fortunate?
