## HAPPY NEW YEAR!

We began the year 2015 with a membership meeting on February 14 in Morgan Hill, CA. Guest was a WW II Navy veteran who was prominently featured in regional major newspapers as the original Navy frogman, predecessor to the Navy Seal. A check with the Library of Congress confirmed the background of this veteran. Unfortunately, he turned out to be a fraud revealed later at another event by a local TV station investigator using the Stolen Valor Act of 2005 to obtain records otherwise not accessible. The veteran did in fact serve in the Navy during World War II. However, he never performed any duties with the famed underwater demolition team. We have learned an important lesson from this incident. As a matter of policy for future speakers/presenters at FFNV events, we will select them only by personal knowledge and by recommendation of our members.

The Nisei Veterans Memorial Service was held on May 16 at Roberts Park, Oakland Hills, CA. As in the past, the Band of the West welcomed all attendees with music echoing through the redwood forest. We saw more "outside attendees" who were attracted by the newspaper article about this memorial service. Lawson Sakai delivered an informative speech about his experiences with the 442<sup>nd</sup> Regimental Combat Team (442<sup>nd</sup> RCT). We also noted that the redwood tree planted by E Company veterans in 1992 for all veterans was growing majestically. The potluck lunch/picnic following the service was enjoyed by all.

Our next event on August 15, aboard the USS Hornet retired WW II Aircraft Carrier Museum in Alameda, CA, was a huge success. As previously announced, FFNV no longer sponsors a gathering aboard the Hornet. Coincidentally, the Hornet staff had asked us if we would agree to highlighting the 442<sup>nd</sup> RCT during one of the Hornet's popular monthly Living Ship Day. We jumped on it because it would give us another great opportunity to tell the legendary exploits of the 442<sup>nd</sup> RCT. The theme of the event was the "Rescue of the Lost Battalion." Tom Graves introduced the speakers and skillfully moderated the event. Franz Steidl, author of "Lost Battalions," presented the background and profoundly highlighted the Al Tortolano, a soldier in the Lost Battalion significance of the rescue. (1st Battalion, 141 Infantry) gave a heartwarming account of being rescued when all hopes for survival were diminished on October 30, 1944, Vosges Forest, France. Then, Lawson Sakai made an inspirational and eloquent presentation of the successful rescue from the 442<sup>nd</sup> RCT perspective - never giving up despite taking heavy casualties. The Hornet staff had prepared for 100 attendees - there were more than 300 who truly enjoyed the event which was covered by local television broadcasts in evening/late night news.

The grand finale of 2015 was the reunion in Las Vegas, October 18-22 with almost 300 attendees. We were encouraged to see over 40 World War II veterans there. The welcome banquet featured presentations by Cathy Uchida ("What Will Become of the Monuments' Men of Little Tokyo"), Stuart Hirai (70th Anniversary Study Tour of Italy), Brian Yamamoto (Military Intelligence Service Historic Sites) and Jules Bonjour (author of "War and Betrayal"). The farewell luncheon began with an accomplished taiko performance by Christine Bowes. The familiar soothing voice singing the national anthem again belonged to Chris Yahng. The keynote speaker was Anais Casin of Bruyeres Tourism Office. She made an excellent presentation on Bruyeres' effort to build an Interpretive Museum for the Liberation of Vosges to specifically recognize and honor the 442<sup>nd</sup> RCT. Tom Graves also gave an informative account of the presentation ceremony in San Francisco of the French Legion of Honor to 442<sup>nd</sup> RCT and other WW II vets who served in France. Many raffle prizes were given out. As always, entertainment by Sons, Daughters, and Friends of the 100<sup>th</sup> was appreciated by all. Steve Sato of the 100<sup>th</sup> made a classy end to the luncheon by leading farewell/Aloha Oe.
