EXPLANATION OF COURSES

BB 312 PASTORAL EPISTLES

An expository study of I & II Timothy and Titus, emphasizing the daily responsibility of ministering to the people of God.

BB 101 OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY

A historical overview of the Old Testament as a chronological unit or as a book by book survey, with emphasis on the redemptive theme that runs throughout the Old Testament.

PH 204 SYSTEMATIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINES II

A continuation of PH203 including surveying the doctrines of salvation, the New Testament church, angels, Satan and end-time events.

BB 110 THE LIFE AND TEACHINGS OF JESUS

The life of Christ examined chronologically, including a survey of his teachings as recorded in the Gospels.

LC 101 PRINCIPLES OF WRITTEN ENGLISH I

This course will emphasize proper grammar, sentence structure, paragraph breaks, and progression of thought in producing acceptable communications.

HS 141 CHURCH HISTORY I

An examination of the church from its beginning through the Middle Ages (30-1500 A.D.), emphasizing the movement of believers, who, seeking to follow Scripture, rejected the worldly state church system.
