
Red Nose Day - Making a difference to a worthwhile cause

Reports

As you may well be aware, the national curriculum levels are being removed (with the exception of Year Two and Year Six this year) and are being replaced by age related expectations. The new national Curriculum is of a somewhat higher standard than the previous curriculum. A letter detailing these changes will be attached to the reports.

A parents evening letter will be sent home this week for families with children in reception and Year Two. Due to the end of year assessments in Year two and in reception, reports are sent at the end of the year for this year group.

NEWS from the IEB

The two weeks since the end of half-term have been both busy and productive. During last week we had our termly inspection from HMI and your children were magnificent. They were happy and engaged in their learning and were polite and well-behaved throughout the week. We should receive the Inspector's report in the next 2-3 weeks and it will be put on the school's website as soon as we have it. We are also scheduling a meeting for parents on **Wednesday 25**th **March at 7:30pm** at which we will review the report and answer any questions about it. In the event that we haven't received the report by then, we would still plan to hold the meeting so that we can provide a general update to parents.

Thank you to everyone who completed the Parent View questionnaire on the Ofsted website. We will be reviewing your responses when we meet as an IEB next week and ensure that the actions that we have planned over the coming months will address the issues and concerns that have been raised.

Following discussions with the Local Authority, we are receiving some extra support until the end of this term from two very experienced Headteachers. Mr Anthony Marsh is the Headteacher at Whyteleafe Primary School and Mr Ian Keary is Head of School at The Glyn Secondary School. They provide additional School Improvement Support to work on the priorities that Mrs Scutter and Mrs Brooks have identified.

We have also been having discussions with the Department for Education (DfE) and the Good Shepherd Trust (GST) about the school's academisation. There will be a meeting next week between the DfE, GST, Surrey County Council, IEB and the school's leadership to plan the actions necessary between now and September. This will include a review of any physical or environmental improvements that may be needed and the GST will also be seeking parents' views on improvements that are required. We will provide an update on this at the meeting on 25th March.

Finally, a huge 'thank you' to everyone who has been involved in fundraising activities with FOTW this term. It's very clear that the organising team know how to put the 'fun' into fundraising!
