

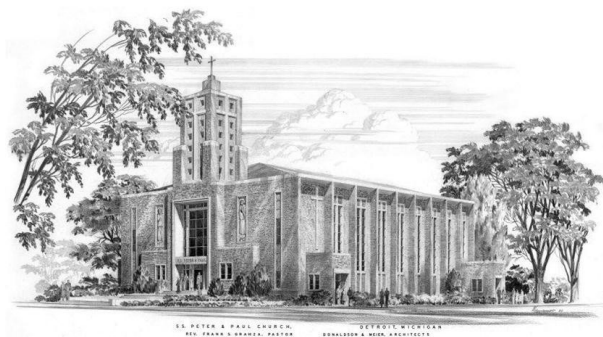

#### I WAS THINKING...

The second window on the east side (Grandville side) in front of the ushers' room, top right part depicts Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Mount Carmel is a mountain overlooking the plain of Galilee. It became famous because it was there that the prophet Elijah worked a miracle. Chapter 18 of the Bible's First Book of Kings tells how Elijah stood up to the 450 prophets of the false god, Baal. Through his prayers, Elijah obtained a miracle from God to prove that Elijah's God was the true God.

Centuries later, in the thirteenth century, a group of European monks began to live on Mount Carmel. They honored Mary, the Mother of God, as Our Lady of Mount Carmel. For this reason the people began to call them friars of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel. This was the way the Carmelite Order began. Pope Honorius III approved the Order's Rule in 1226. Simon Stock, an Englishman, became the superior of all the Carmelites in 1247. He helped the Order expand and adapt to the times. He patterned the Order on the Dominicans and Franciscans.

On July 16, 1251, Mary appeared to St. Simon and gave him the brown scapular. She promised her protection to all those who would wear the blessed habit. Many miracles proved her words. St. Pius X was pope from 1903 until 1914. He said that people could have the same blessings if they would wear the scapular medal. This medal has a picture of Our Lady of the Scapular on one side and the Sacred Heart on the other. Simon Stock died in Bordeaux, France, in 1265.

On November 16 of each year, in Palmi (Italy), is commemorated the earthquake of 1894, which had its epicenter in the city and in which an event occurred defined as the "miracle of Our Lady of Mount Carmel". For 17 days preceding this earthquake many of the faithful had reported strange eye movements and changes in the coloring of the face in a statue of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The local and national press reported these strange occurrences and in the evening of November 16, the faithful improvised a procession carrying the statue of Our Lady through the streets. When the procession reached the end of the city, a violent earthquake shook the whole district of Palmi, ruining most of the houses along the way of the procession. Only nine people died out of a population of about 15,000 inhabitants, as almost all of the population had been on the street, as a result of the procession. Therefore a commemoration of the 1894 procession takes place each year accompanied with the firing of firecrackers and lights.

The Catholic Church has officially recognized the miracle, crowning the statue November 16, 1896 as a result of the decree issued by the Vatican Chapter on September 22, 1895.

The top part of the stained glass window presents red, violet and purple cross with an emblem features a mountain peak in the center, to symbolize Mount Carmel, and three stars. As for the meaning of the three stars, they could represent the Holy Trinity but usually they don't. One interpretation is that the upper stars represent Elijah and Elisha, patriarchs of the Order, and the lower star represents the Blessed Virgin Mary. Carmelites are a Marian Order and the star at the foot of the cross represents Mary as Queen of Carmel. The position of that star on the emblem is to show that Mary is at the heart of the Church.

A different interpretation, however, is from Alex Roman who tells us that... "...three stars are often found on Eastern Orthodox icons of the Blessed Virgin Mary - on her shoulders and on her forehead. Those three stars signify that she was a Virgin "Before, During and After" the Birth of Christ. Given the strong Marian character of the Carmelites, it is truly an appropriate symbolism. Mary herself is often referred to liturgically as the "Uncut



Mountain” and also relates to an Old Testament prophecy that the Messiah will come “from a Mountain, densely wooded”.

The fact that the middle star is at the base of Mount Carmel also gave rise to the title of the Virgin Mary “Star of the Sea” who is invoked by those travelling on water.

The brown color not only relates to the earth (of the mountain), but also to the skin color of the original icon of Our Lady of Mount Carmel that the Carmelites brought to Rome from the Holy Land and which is now kept in the Cathedral of Naples, Italy. She is called “La Bruna” owing to Her brown, dark skin color.

Below the cross there is the title: “Our LADY OF MT. CARMEL”

Below there is the figure of Blessed Virgin Mary and young Jesus sitting on Her lap.

Jesus is holding the brown scapulars in both hands. The one held in His left hand shows the picture of Him and His Blessed Mother. The one in His right hand depicts the Mount Carmel Peak, Cross and the three stars. The figure of the Blessed Virgin is holding a similar scapular.

We celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 16<sup>th</sup>.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel, pray for us!

### Co TY możesz zrobić dla swojej parafii?

Katolicy często myślą, że ponieważ Kościół jest tak dobrze zorganizowany, w każdej parafii są „ludzie” do każdego zadania. Szczerze mówiąc, bez pomocy i wsparcia tych z nas siedzących w ławkach kościelnych, nawet światła w naszym kościele nie byłyby włączone. Nasza Parafia potrzebuje każdego z nas, aby pomagać i wspierać księdza proboszcza i jego współpracowników w pracy dla Chrystusa i Jego Kościoła. W jaki sposób możesz pomóc?

#### 1. Módl się

Najlepszym sposobem, w jaki możesz służyć naszej parafii jest Twoje aktywne uczestnictwo we Mszy Świętej Niedzielnej i w Święta Obowiązkowe. Gdy złączysz swoje modlitwy z modlitwami wszystkich parafian i poprzez swoją obecność pokażesz jak ważne dla Ciebie jest uczestnictwo w życiu eucharystycznym Twojej Parafii, umocnisz całe Ciało Chrystusa. Podczas Mszy Świętej lub w czasie Twojej modlitwy osobistej, poproś Ducha Świętego, aby wskazał Ci także inne drogi służenia i umacniania Twojej Parafii.

#### 2. Znajdź odpowiednie zajęcie

Każdy z nas otrzymał różne dary. Popatrz na wszystkie umiejętności i talenty, które otrzymałeś(-aś) od Pana Boga i zastanów się jak najlepiej możesz je wykorzystać. Masz talent do wystąpień publicznych, nie masz tremy? Zapisz się na szkolenie dla Lektorów. Masz wielkie i szczerze nabożeństwo do Pana Jezusa obecnego w Najświętszym Sakramencie? Pomyśl o zostaniu Nadzwyczajnym Szafarzem Komunii Świętej. Masz pragnienie służenia przy Ołtarzu, pomagania kapłanowi podczas

Mszy Świętej i nabożeństw? Zostań Ministrantem. Chciałbyś pomóc innym ludziom? Skontaktuj się z Michael’em Thomas, naszym Koordynatorem Christian Service. Istnieje wiele różnych sposobów aby pomóc innym. Aby dowiedzieć się więcej, zadzwoń do Kancelarii Parafialnej.

#### 3. Informator Parafialny

Nasza Parafia wydaje Informator Parafialny „Parish Directory” z prawie wszystkim co mamy do zaoferowania; od Sakramentów do różnych możliwości wolontariatu. W Informatorze są także ważne informacje o pogrzebach i ślubach. Proszę weź jeden Informator dla siebie i weź jeszcze jeden i przekazaj znajomym. Kopie Informatora Parafialnego znajdują się przy wejściach do naszego kościoła.

#### 4. Katecheza

Nasza Parafia oferuje niedzielną katechezę dla dzieci w wieku przedszkolnym, a także katechezę dla dzieci K-8. Prowadzimy także katechezę dla dorosłych (Obrzędy Chrześcijańskiego Wtajemniczenia Dorosłych)(R.C.I.A.). Bardzo ważnym zadaniem jest nauczanie naszych dzieci wiary katolickiej. Inną, ważną częścią misji Kościoła jest przyprowadzanie nowych ludzi do wiary! Każdy może znaleźć tu coś dla siebie! Masz pragnienie przekazywania wiary przyszłym pokoleniom? Pomyśl o pomocy przy katechezie!

#### 5. Czytaj Biuletyn Parafialny

Biuletyn jest bardzo ważnym narzędziem do kontaktu z wszystkimi parafianami. Raz w tygodniu weź Biuletyn Parafialny i przeczytaj go „od deski do deski”. Zobaczysz informacje o nadchodzących wydarzeniach parafialnych oraz znajdziesz tam także apele o pomoc w pomaganiu innym. Bądź w pełni poinformowany o tym, co się dzieje w Twojej własnej Parafii!

#### 6. Sprawdź w internecie

Dokładamy wszelkich starań, aby bieżące informacje były dostępne na Parish App, parafialnej stronie internetowej i na parafialnej stronie Facebook. Sprawdzaj je często aby otrzymać najnowsze informacje. Chciałbyś zobaczyć coś innego (więcej informacji) na naszych stronach? Daj nam znać!

#### 7. Przyprowadź znajomych

Ma to krytyczne znaczenie dla Twojej Parafii. Rozejrzyj się. Ławki są puste. Musimy zachęcać innych aby przyszli do kościoła! Znasz kogoś, kto przestał chodzić do Kościoła? Przyprowadź go z powrotem! Masz w rodzinie kogoś, kto doszedł do wniosku, że Kościół jest mu do wiary i zbawienia niepotrzebny? Przyprowadź go z powrotem! Rzeczywistość Parafii Świętych Apostołów Piotra i Pawła jest bardzo prosta: nasza Parafia pozostaje otwarta, ponieważ wynajmujemy budynek szkoły szkole prywatnej. Zapewnia nam stały dochód aby utrzymać naszą Parafię. Chociaż szkoła czarterowa jest błogosławieństwem, nikt nie może nam obiecać, że będzie tu na czas nieokreślony. W Detroit szkoły są zamykanie na lewo i prawo.

Nasza kolekta z każdej soboty i niedzieli, która średnio wynosi około \$2,000.00, jest tak bardzo potrzebna i dziękujemy

Panu Bógu i każdemu z Was za te ofiary. Jednakże, nie jest to wystarczające, aby pokryć wszystkie koszty związane z utrzymaniem tak dużego kompleksu kościelnego. Zapewnienie przyszłości naszej Parafii zrealizuje się tylko wtedy, gdy będziemy mieli dużą liczbę parafian, którzy będą regularnie przychodzili do kościoła i wspomagali naszą Parafię finansowo.

#### 8. Bądź pozytywny i po prostu zrób to!

Bardzo często w naszej Parafii daje się odczuć chmurę negatywności. Ludzie narzekają i rozmawiają między sobą o czymś, co usłyszeli, o czymś, co się im nie podoba itp. Szczerze mówiąc takie zachowanie odepchnęło wielu ludzi od Kościoła! Nie marnuj czasu na plotki, domysły, obmowy i „gdybanie”! Musisz wziąć pod uwagę, czy takie zachowanie jest najlepsze dla Ciebie, Twojej duszy i Twojej Parafii. Konstruktywna krytyka jest mile widziana. Masz jakiegokolwiek pomysły, obawy czy zapytania przyjdź na spotkanie Rady Parafialnej i pozytywnie wyraż swoją opinię!

Z modlitwą rozważ w jaki sposób możesz zaangażować się bardziej w życie Chrystusowego Kościoła i Twojej Parafii, a następnie po prostu zrób to!

**Gregorian Chant (From "Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship" by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops" in 2007)**

Gregorian chant is uniquely the Church's own music. Chant is a living connection with our forebears in the faith, the traditional music of the Roman rite, a sign of communion with the universal Church, a bond of unity across cultures, a means for diverse communities to participate together in song, and a summons to contemplative participation in the Liturgy. ***The Second Vatican Council directed that the faithful be able to sing parts of the Ordinary of the Mass together in Latin.***

The Ordinary of the Mass that we are singing at all Masses is in the Breaking Bread Hymnal. Please follow along and sing as best you can. (Kyrie/Lord have Mercy: #848; Sanctus/Holy, Holy: #850; Mysterium Fidei/Mystery of Faith: #851; Agnus Dei/Lamb of God: #854)
