By now, I hope you have heard the news about St. Mark's Episcopal Church, but just in case you've missed it here's the short version to catch you up. St. Mark's has been in a difficult financial place for some time. For the last few years they have not been able to worship in their sanctuary in the winter because it was too expensive to heat. Also, for the last few years, they have only had pulpit supply for clergy support. Earlier this summer we invited the people of St. Mark's to consider just visiting with us over the winter months instead of moving to their fellowship hall. Several weeks ago their leadership met to consider coming to visit but by the end of their meeting they had come to a new conclusion. They decided to develop a proposal to bring to Prince of Peace that was a real leap of faith.

Their proposal was to begin worshiping with us starting January 1, 2015 and to hire me to be their half time priest for one year. I would be paid half time by Prince of Peace and half time by St. Marks and therefore be full time serving both congregations from the same office. They asked us if we would like to try this arrangement out for a year and see how it went. This isn't a proposal for a merger. St. Mark's needs to stay as their own congregation as they decide how to divest their property and care for the ministries that happen in their facilities. Officially, they will be simply visiting with us if this proposal is approved.

This past Sunday in worship we talked about this idea during the sermon and the congregation was very supportive of the idea. In the council meeting which followed worship, the council voted to pursue the idea and in the next few weeks will meet with their council to develop a plan which everyone from both leadership teams supports. We hope to get that proposed plan out to the whole congregation in the week following October 5th and then on October 19th, right after worship, we'll meet as a congregation to ask for your blessing on this path forward.

While the people of St. Mark's won't become official members of Prince of Peace, I do dearly hope that we will take some time to imagine ourselves in their shoes. How would you feel, if the faithful thing to do meant leaving 209 Eastern Avenue? How would you feel taking a leap of faith and

trusting a neighboring congregation to catch you after the leap? How would you hope to be "caught" by that other church and what would a gentle landing look like? One of the biggest concerns both congregations share is in how will worship look. My personal hope is that we don't have separate "Episcopal" and "Lutheran" worship but that we find a way to fully integrate our worship so that we might learn and grow from the gifts we all bring to this new adventure. I believe everyone will be amazed at just how very similar our worship really is, but it will still take some courage to trust that to be true and some patience as we work though the very minor differences and come to a common understanding.

I would ask you to please keep the people of St. Marks, the people of Prince of Peace, the leaders and me in your prayers in the weeks to come.

Mustard Seeds Update

Just a couple of months ago, Pastor Erik and several members of Prince of Peace initiated a conversation with the other K6 churches about a collaborative effort to start a new education program. At that first meeting, I don't think anyone could have imagined what a great success it would be so soon! On Sunday afternoons, we have four classrooms serving thirty or more kids and an adult education program. After the education hour, we share a joyful meal together. There can be no question that this is a ministry that people wanted and needed.

Now that we have the people, and hope to continue growing, the real work begins... How do we offer an experience that is meaningful? Just bringing people together is important in its own right, but we want to offer more than that. We want an educational curriculum for our children that lays a foundation of knowledge about the biblical stories, but also allows them to wrestle with the text, asking questions and looking for the blessing in it. And, we want them to have fun, to interact with their peers, and to see church as a safe and joyful space. These things require lots of planning and lots of help. We have about fifteen people who have agreed to help in the classrooms, but we could really use more people so that no one gets overburdened by their teaching commitment. Volunteers never have to teach alone, and lessons are prepared ahead of time for you. If you are interested, please contact me or Pastor Erik.

Even if teaching or working with kids isn't your thing, if you haven't been to Mustard Seeds yet, please come! This is not intended to be a program solely for parents and their children. This experience can only be enriched by the participation of folks of all ages. We have an exciting discussion going on in the Adult Education classroom, and the shared meal is a great time to meet new people or even to get to know better those you worship with already. Sunday afternoons are a time to discover a new and exciting way to be a community and worship together, and we want you to be a part of it!

Mission and Ministry Exploration

I attended a meeting on Saturday, September 20,2014 at the Mt. Vernon Community Center. Prince of Peace and the 5 Episcopal churches that are part of the K- 6 group met to share a dialogue. We discussed ideas and dreams of what the world could look like in 20 years. It was a day of thinking big! The group established a list of things we would want to see change. Peace, eradication of poverty, justice for all, and that each person would know that they are loved were just a few of the "dreams" we'd like to see as the reality in the year 2034.

The next phase of the day was to determine what the United States would need to be the leader in making this change a reality. Now if you are following along here, you might have already guessed that the third phase was to determine what Maine would need to do to lead the United States in this change. This was difficult work. It was hard to identify specific steps that would move this work forward.

Our final stage was how the K-6 group gathered Saturday, could lead the state of Maine towards this goal. I don't have the final "notes" from the day, but they are coming soon. What was surprising was that many of the items on each groups list had many things in common. Including creating a clearing-house to help match needs with services already available within the churches. It also focused on "justice", ways to eliminate or reduce the need for services by looking at the root of the problems and potentially helping reduce the need over time.

We ended with some sharing of what each church could do in the next 2 to 3 weeks. Our list from Prince of Peace was to "invite". Bring someone who hasn't been to our church with you to service, bible study, cleanup day, Mustard Seeds or any activity or gathering we have. The second was to help with the burial of a young boy who took his life recently and has no "family" to play the role in making arrangements. We already shared with idea with our K6 brothers and sisters in Christ and will possibly move forward with this in the coming days.

Don Sproul, LouAnne Story, Nancy Merrill, Becky Pearce, Heidi Joslyn, Pastor Erik and myself (Beth Pfeffer) attended. Any of us would be glad to chat about the day. The dreams we dreamed could easily be the next mission and ministry programs supported by these six churches within the Augusta area.

Our new K-6 "Mustard Seeds" Christian Education Program was awarded a \$10,000. grant! A big "Thank You!" to the Episcopal Diocese of Maine!!!

Confirmation: We did not confirm any students last year and had no active confirmation class. This year we have a group of 6 - and if we missed anyone we will make room for you! Pastor Erik and Beth Pfeffer will be teaching, rotating weeks, beginning October 5th at 4 p.m. We will join the Mustard Seed "gang" for opening and then head into our own space for a dynamic and exciting class starting with a look at the our ancestors from the Old Testament.

1st Communion: Fall is a very busy time and it includes beginning the instruction that prepares our youth for first communion. We don't set a specific age for first communion, but rather provide the instruction when children are ready. We will not have any other Sunday morning program offerings at this time, but will encourage all to participate in the 4:00 pm Sunday afternoon book study "*We Make the Road by Walking*" by Brian McLaren. The future may change that, but for now we want to fully support the 4:00 pm time slot with all of our energies. Watch the newsletter and bulletin for upcoming changes.

Education Meeting: Please join me, Beth Pfeffer, at the next Education Meeting which will be held on October 12th in the triple room right after the 9:00 service. I encourage you to join me to help plan any and all education events here at Prince of Peace.
