PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Who are we?

What "makes" our school? What do WE want for our kids when they are sent to a building nestled into a neighborhood for six and a half hours a day, 180 days of the year? Is what we want something that we should want? How do we know? How can we know?

Truth is, we won't always agree 100% of the time on what is best for kids--but yet we still do the best we can. When kids are in school, we are raising them together and because they present their whole selves to us, with all their young and developing knowledge, skills, emotions, and behaviors, we do the best we can in the moments we have them to guide, nurture, and teach them toward lives worth living.

The sad news from Marysville-Pilchuck only serves to highlight the fact that our work at raising kids will never be complete; it will always be fret with worry and uncertainty; bad things will always happen--despite a community's best efforts at prevention, proactive intervention, and safety, pain and suffering is inevitable. But this is not to mean we let those thoughts and feelings dominate our thinking or our world view. Instead, we strive to create a place in which school can be the best part of each child's day, every day they show up. It's not always easy to do but yet it can sometimes be as easy as a smile, a hug, or a fist bump!

Having served as the proud principal of View Ridge over the past 9 years, I can say this with certainty: we as a staff can never go wrong when students and their families feel that we care deeply for them--that we love them. For more than anything else, more than reading and math scores, more than curriculum and assessments, more than teaching strategies and school expectations and graduation rates, the thing that matters most is the human connection we make through relationships that truly make a difference. We're not always perfect at this because we are human and learners too. But, if I read our community correctly, I see this as a fundamental value that is almost universal. And it is why most View Ridge families, the overwhelming majority, truly love their school.

It is ONLY through relationships built on trust, safety, warmth, and love that can help our kids navigate through the unexpected and sometimes tragic events in our lives. Deep relationship fosters resiliency, and in the face of adversity, it is the resilient who

Learning Assistance Program Services:

Students at View Ridge Elementary school benefit from support through the Learning Assistance Program (LAP). The LAP program is designed to provide supplemental support to students who are identified as in need of additional assistance to meet Common Core state reading and math standards.

Your child may receive support through LAP throughout the year. We are continually monitoring our students' progress. If we identify that your child needs additional assistance with a skill or a concept, our reading specialists and highly skilled paraeducators may work with your child in his or her classroom following the teacher's instruction. Or your child might be pulled out of the classroom into a small group for a few minutes of review. LAP support is always a second dose of instruction in addition to what occurs in your child's classroom. The students receiving support vary from day to day depending upon what skill is being taught.
