1. CURRICULUM WORKSHOP

SANASE hosted a very successful Curriculum Workshop at Carpe Diem School in George on 18 & 19 June 2015. The workshop provided a valuable opportunity to the National Department of Education to update provinces on the latest developments regarding the Skills Qualification and Learning Programmes for Special Schools in the country. The Workshop was attended by 403 delegates from all 9 (nine) provinces in South Africa. Feedback received from the delegates attending the workshop was very positive and many schools perceive this Skills and Vocational CAPS as a step in the right direction. The rationale for such a Skills & Vocational Learning Programme could be regarded as the culmination of years of dedicated work done by the SANASE Interprovincial Curriculum Committee (IPCC). Members of the National Curriculum Task Team under the leadership of Dr Moses Simelane and Ms Marie Schoeman formed part of the Workshop Programme. The presenters, all masters of their respective fields of expertise, competently shared invaluable knowledge with all members present. On publication for public comments all Special Schools will be invited to provide SANASE with input on the Skill & Vocational Learning Programme. SANASE will collate the information received from all schools into one discussion document which will be forwarded to the DBE. Progress on special needs curriculum

During a workshop at Carpe Diem School on 18 and 19 June Dr Moses Simelane, the director of Inclusive Education at the Department of Basic Education, had some good news for the 400 delegates from 170 special needs schools. Hesaid his department is in the final stages of developing a General Education and Training Certificate qualification and learning programme for pupils with intellectual disabilities. "This process is long overdue and has taken many years to get off the ground."

Andre Nel, chairman of the interprovincial curriculum committee of the South African Association of Special Education (SANASE), told the workshop that this conference is a milestone for pupils with special education needs. "The department has reached the halfway mark in compiling the curriculum for pupils that are in-

tellectually challenged and today we are assessing the progress that has been made. Your input will be taken into consideration."

The SANASE is a legal entity that supports institutions dealing with pupils with special needs. It enables the pupils to develop their potential towards responsible, meaningful and independent adulthood through the appropriate and relevant education and training systems.

Nel, who was the former headmaster of Randeor School in Mondeor, Gauteng, for almost 20 years before retiring at the end of 2014, said until now there has not been a curriculum and qualification specifically for these pupils. "The exciting part of the curriculum is that we envisage including skills vocational learning programmes that offer the pupils different carreer pathways such as plumbing and hairdressing that can contribute to alleviating the acute skills shortage in the country."

2. SANASE CONFERENCE 20 – 22 August 2015

2.1 Conference Programme

A final Conference Programme will be forwarded to all delegates who have registered for the Conference.

2.2 Transport

The Premier Hotel provides a free shuttle service from the *O.R Tambo Airport to the hotel and back*. It however is imperative that delegates complete the transport schedule and **fax it to the Premier Hotel by no later than 11 August 2015.** The contact details of the Premier Hotel have been included on the shuttle service booking form.

Please be advised that delegates who made alternative accommodation arrangements will have to organise their own means of transport for the duration of the Conference.

2.3 Election procedure 2015

SANASE National Elections will form part of the AGM. In order to ensure a fair election process all delegates will be expected to conform to the set standards for the election process. Members are therefore referred to the new SANASE Constitution, sections **No.** <u>12</u> (ELECTIONS) in its entirety and <u>No. 9.2</u> (Elections & Term of Office).

- Every school registered with SANASE and attending the AGM will have **only two votes**. In the event of more than two members from a school attending the AGM, **only two** members must be mandated to exercise their votes on behalf of the school they are representing.
- Nomination forms will be included in the Conference resource pack.
- At registration each school will receive two tokens which later during the voting process could be exchanged for two ballot papers stamped with an original SANASE stamp.

2.4 Conduct Guidelines to be adhered to during the Annual General Meeting

Delegates attending the Conference are kindly requested to familiarise themselves with the following guidelines pertaining to conduct during the AGM:

- Come to the meeting with a positive attitude
- Be prompt in arriving to the meeting and returning from breaks.
- All matters raised must be directed to the person chairing the meeting. (Talk one at a time, waiting to be recognised by the chairperson)
- Limit side conversations.
- Respect time
- Be patient when listening to others and do not interrupt them.
- Value the input/views of others.
- Address any concerns about discussions or the meeting with the Chairperson. The Chairperson is tasked with the responsibility of bringing the meeting to order.

3. MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATES

The NEC would like to extend a warm word of welcome to all those schools that have joined SANASE in 2015. They, NEC members, would at the same time like to thank all those schools who have renewed their membership with SANASE. As a token of appreciation and loyalty shown towards its members, all member schools of SANASE will receive a framed copy of their membership certificate for 2015. These framed membership certificates will be handed out at the National Conference in August.
