## December is closer than you think!

The GISD Council of PTAs conducts our part of Reflections contest judging in early December. This year, local entries will need to be turned in to the Council Reflections Chairman in the Harris Hill Administration Building Annex either:

Friday, December 6th from 3-7 pm or Saturday, December 7th from 8-10 a.m.

Late arrivals cannot be accepted, as judging will begin promptly at 10 a.m. on Saturday.

#### **CHECKLIST**

Before bringing your entries to Council, please ensure that they are properly prepared and you have completed the following items:

- Ensure that your local unit has paid their Council dues.
- Please complete the local PTA participation form online through the Texas PTA website. http://www.formsite.com/txpta/form881229016/index.html
- Please complete the Advancing Entries Spreadsheet and forward a copy to the Council Reflections chair, s.wainscott@verizon.net, prior to December 6th. Local PTAs may advance up to 20% of each grade division and arts category, or at least one from each grade division and arts category.
- Properly prepared entries (see lists elsewhere on this page)

#### LITERATURE ENTRIES:

- One original and one copy of the entry submitted in a manila file folder. The original entry should be stapled inside the folder unless it is being submitted in booklet form. Keep one entry on file at your campus for your records.
- Pages numbered, student's name written on the back of each page, in case the pages get separated.
- Entry form placed in a sheet protector stapled to the back (outside) of the manila folder.
- Color dot is placed on the back of the manila folder

#### **VISUAL ATT ENTRIES:**

- Measure the artwork—it should not be larger than 24'x 30" including the mat.
- Mount entry on a cardboard mat, poster board or some other sturdy material.
- This year, Texas PTA has recommended entries be covered with a lightweight paper flap that can be lifted for viewing artwork.
   Do not shrink wrap or cover in plastic.
- Place the entry form in a sheet protector and tape it to the back of the artwork. Do not tape over the sheet protector opening.
- Color dot placed on the back of the work.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY ENTRIES:

- Measure the photograph. It cannot be larger than 11" x 14" including the mat.
- · Mount photo on a cardboard mat, poster board or some other sturdy material.
- This year, Texas PTA has recommended entries be covered with a lightweight paper flap that can be lifted for viewing photographs.

  Do not shrink wrap or cover in plastic.
- Place the entry form in a clear plastic sheet protector and tape it to the back of the photograph. Do not tape over the opening to the sheet protector.
- Color dot is placed on the back of the work

#### COLORED DOTS

Colored "garage sale" dots are used by council to quickly identify the entries during judging. If you have some of these dots in the appropriate color(s), you can save a little time by putting these on your entries before coming to Harris Hill building. However, we will have dots available for you to use. (Do not go and purchase them just for this.)

NOTE: If you are an elementary school and you do not put dots on before bringing the entries to council, please have the entries separated by grade level (grades prek-2 and grades 3-5).

Grades Prek-2nd: Red
Grades 3rd – 5th: Blue
Grades 6-8: Yellow
Grades 9-12: Green
Special Artists: No Dots

#### **MUSICAL COMPOSITION ENTRIES:**

- CD should be in a plastic or cardboard container. Identify both the CD and the container with student's name, grade division, state, and year.
- Place the CD and musical score (if required) inside a manila envelope
- Entry form in a sheet protector taped to the back of the envelope
- Color dot on the back of envelope

#### SEPTEMBER ELEMENTARY WINNER



### **Monthly Outstanding PTA Activity Guidelines**

During the school year, the Council PTA sponsors a monthly "Outstanding PTA" awards program. The program not only allows local PTAs to let their light shine and earn recognition for their work, but it also allows us to share successful strategies and ideas with the other local PTAs in the school district.

#### Entries can be mailed, delivered in person, or emailed. The guidelines are pretty simple:

- Complete the Entry Cover Form with general contact information for your PTA and your campus, and include with your entry.
- Write a description of your PTA's activity that includes the information listed on the Outstanding PTA Award Application attached.
- A maximum of 300 words, handwritten or typed will be accepted.
- Please do not use your PTA name within the text (all PTA names are covered for judging)
- If you have copies of flyers, programs, photos, etc. to support your entry, please feel free to include. However, do not send "one of a kind" items, as they will not be returned.

Your PTA may submit only one entry per month - but you are not limited to a timeframe for any given entry. For example, a program from the end of one school year can be submitted at the beginning of the next school year.

Judges will consider the originality of idea, participation of parents, staff, and students, as well as community involvement. Keep the Objects of PTA in mind as you plan the entry.

During the annual PTA Spring Luncheon, scheduled for Wednesday, May 1, 2013, the Council will present "Outstanding PTA of the Year" awards. Your PTA must enter at least three (3) monthly contests during the 2012-13 school year to be eligible to submit an entry for the **Outstanding PTA of the Year.**
