Community meals service



The Consultation

Introduction

Trafford Council provides a range of social care services to adults across the Borough. Rated excellent by the Care Quality Commission, adult social care has a good track record of working with service users, carers and organisations to deliver high quality services.

Trafford Council, like many other Councils, has to respond to a major reduction in its funding over the next three years. Over the next two years, we estimate that we will have to reduce our budget by a further \pounds 33.3m. We will continue with a programme of reviewing internal services, ensuring that they provide value for money. However, due to the spending reductions we need to make, we also have to review the services we provide to those living and working in Trafford. This will include adult social care. In 2013-14 adult social care will need to reduce costs by \pounds 4.9 million. We will be doing this by reducing back office costs and other efficiencies. However, we will need to reduce costs further in the coming year.

We have produced a general information leaflet to tell people how we propose to meet the challenges ahead. This leaflet outlines the specific proposal in relation to the provision of meals.

The Proposal – Meals Service

Within Trafford we currently subsidise the delivery of 450 meals each week to individuals' homes. In recent years, Trafford Council has supported luncheon clubs to develop a more sustainable model. This has been done by focussing on the recruitment of volunteers, improving efficiencies and forming links with similar services and businesses to support and sustain the identified unit cost. This model has enabled and enhanced social interaction within the community, reducing isolation as well as increasing the independence of the business / group and its members.

Meals are part of people's day-to-day expenditure – everyone has to pay for meals. We are therefore consulting on the proposal to no longer provide a community meals service. Instead we will support people to access and purchase meals from a wide range of alternative sources.

In order to meet the proposed £79,000 savings within the meals services, we are proposing to:

 Support assessment and reablement to continue to promote independence and reduce the level of dependency on council services;

- Identify those at most risk to ensure meals are still provided as part of a wider care package;
- Ensure that assessment and reablement signpost service users to a wide range of providers;
- Review the current meals provision and assess options currently available within the community.
