to say or write sth again or more than once



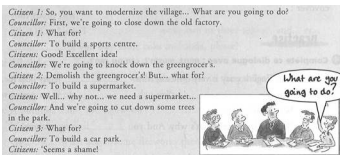

conversations in a book, play, or film / movie



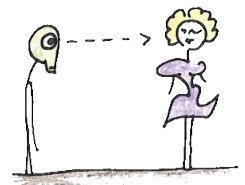

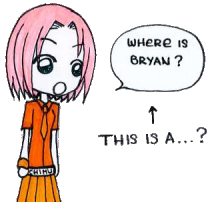

a sentence, phrase or word that asks for information



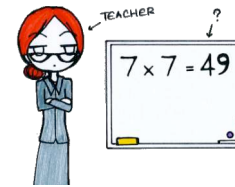
verb

to say or write sth in the form of a question, in order to get information



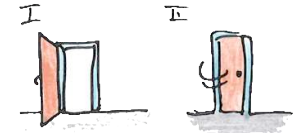
noun

a large board with a smooth black or white surface that teachers write on



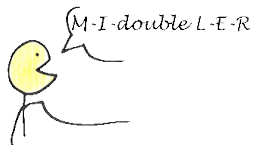
verb

to say or write the letters of a word in the correct order



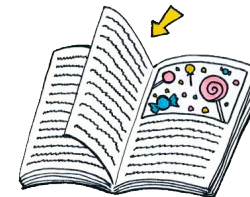
verb

to make letters or numbers on a surface, especially using a pen or a pencil



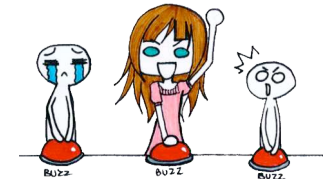
noun
