### PALS Heartcode (On-line at www.heart.org)

This is an on-line pals course. Didactic is provided on line. Upon completion of the didactic portion, a course completion certificate is provided. In order to obtain a PALS Provider card, individuals will need to complete the evaluation stations of PALS course with AHA PALS faculty. Evaluation sessions will be offered in conjunction with update courses (see dates below) Pre-registration is required. Certificate of Completion from Heartcode is required.

APLS: Pediatric Emergency Medicine Course (13 Category 1 CME credits) This is a 2-day advanced course developed by the American Academy of Pediatrics. It is designed to teach physicians how to assess and care for critically ill/injured children in the first few hours in the office or ER setting. (Although this course is designed for physicians, other disciplines involved in treatment of pediatric critical/emergency care are encouraged to attend.)

### PEARS Provider Course (6.0 CEARP contact hours)

This is a 1-day course designed to equip participants to identify pediatric victims as risk of severe cardiopulmonary distress – focus is on early recognition and interventions to stabilize the child while contacting the next level of care. This course is ideal for physicians, nurses, urgent care clinic staff, outpatient clinic staff, school-based and pre-hospital providers as well as senior nursing students who do not routinely care for children.

## **Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course (ENPC) Provider Course**
