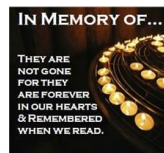

## Memorial Day 15k Bike Ride 5kRun/Walk Remembrance Event

For several years I half-listened to Jim Owen making his sales pitch for the LCC Memorial Day run. An early morning run was the last thing I was interested in doing on Memorial Day. In fact, it was the last thing I was interested in doing at any time, any day. I found absolutely no enjoyment in running! But in May of 2011, my 13 year old son, Jared, announced that he wanted to run on Memorial Day. I thought that was great (for him) and encouraged him to do it. Unfortunately, the running shoes my wife bought for Jared didn't fit him, they fit me. I somehow felt compelled to join him.

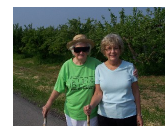


We went for a few runs before Memorial Day and I quickly learned how out of shape I was. My goal was to run the entire 5K without stopping. On that foggy Memorial Day morning, I was surprised to see runners, and walkers of all ages assembling at the camp entrance. Jim Owen took us through some pre-race stretches, inspired us with some stories of cross-country days at Roberts, and explained all the rules and procedures. I took my place in the middle of the pack with my peers; some life-long friends that I grew up with at LCC. We enjoyed some conversation as we got started, but it soon became apparent, that we all needed to breathe more than talk. I remember thinking 5k (3.1 miles) was an incredibly long distance, and I had to fight off the urge to stop running several times.



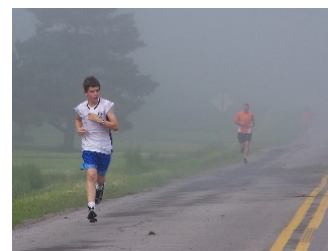
The water station midway was a welcome sight; I had made it halfway! The second half of the loop was easier, as I was encouraged by so many LCC residents and life-long family friends who were completing the first half. It was in the home-stretch that the competitiveness in me began to kick in. Throughout the entire race Joe Hunt and I were playing this cat and mouse game. My goal was no longer just to finish the race without walking...it was to beat Joe Hunt! Through the fog I could see the back of my son's shirt and beyond that the finish line. We had done it!

That was my introduction to an activity my entire family has come to love. I have enjoyed countless runs with each of my five sons and my wife as well. We have participated in many 5k and 10k races together. A year later, in May of 2012, I completed my first marathon and Jared completed his first half marathon. The following day, we participated in our 2<sup>nd</sup> LCC 5k run/walk. This time I decided to walk it, since I could barely walk! I chose Aunt Milly Forth, and Sue Owen as my pacing partners. Aunt Milly had me laughing the whole way and unlike the year before, the 5k went by too quickly. I told Aunt Milly what an inspiration she was, and how I hoped that I would be able to walk 3.1 miles when I am in my 90s!
