Life in the Light

As an eighteen-year-old, Redemptorist Father Don MacLellan worked in a hard-rock mine. On a July afternoon at 2:00 p.m., the mine caved in. He and a couple of other men were trapped underground in the dark for thirty-two hours before they were rescued.

He looked at life very differently after that. A view of life from the perspective of eternity can be terrifying. It can also be clarifying.

Antonio Montesino was a Dominican friar who worked in Cuba 500 years ago. One Sunday he gave a scathing homily in which he told landowners they were in mortal sin for overworking the native people, for not giving them enough to eat, and for stealing their land. The outraged landowners marched directly to the friary to complain to the prior. The prior said the friars agreed with Father Antonio.

I wonder what those landowners think 500 years later - now that they've entered eternity and seen life in the light of God's truth, now that they've seen the consequences of their actions. If they didn't repent during their earthly lives, they may be wishing with eternal regret that they had. They may be wishing they had listened to someone like Antonio Montesino. Saint Ignatius of Loyola often asked people what decisions they would make if they were on their deathbed. From the perspective of eternity, what values would they wish they had lived, and what kind of life would have best helped them express those values?

Saint Francis of Assisi is said to have been hoeing his garden when someone asked him what he'd do if he knew it was his last hour on earth. He paused, then said, "I would keep hoeing my garden." He was able to say that because his life like his garden - was in good order. How many of us can say the same?

Don MacLellan's thirty-two hours in a dark, collapsed mine helped him decide to become a priest. What would you change about your life if you knew today was to be your last day on earth? Would you continue hoeing your garden, or would there be for you - as there were for the landowners of Friar Antonio Montesino's time - situations of injustice you've tolerated as "normal" for too long?

What's your view of life from the perspective of eternity?

What would you like to change? Now do it!
