Dear 4-H Families:



Sheep & Swine Weigh-ins

Weigh-ins for both species will be held at the fairgrounds. COOL forms for each animal weighed in must be turned in. The form can be found at http://waushara.uwex.edu/4h/ LivestockAssoc.html or from the UW-Extension office. Hogs will be weighed in on Saturday, April 21 between 10 am to 1 pm by appointment. We will assign a time and notify you of that prior to the weigh-in. If your hogs are being transported by another family, please let the UW-Extension office know as



soon as possible so you can be assigned times together! Sheep will be weighed in on Saturday, May 12 from 10 am to noon.

All Waushara County 4-H and FFA members interested in selling hogs at the Market Animal Sale held during the fair need to be MAQA certified annually. Project members in beef and sheep are also encouraged to attend an MAQA session to learn valuable information about animal production and management practices. Youth Opportunities

Area Animal Science Day

Oconto County will be hosting Area Animal Science Days on June 29. Dairy, Livestock, and Horse project members are invited to attend.

Dairy Activities: Participants will judge cows and heifers of multiple dairy breeds. A showmanship contest is held in conjunction with the

judging contest. The Dairy Poster Contest is open to all 4 -H members using their own artwork and slogan to make a 14x22 inch poster. Awards



are based on originality, conveying dairy promotion method, and general appearance. Posters are to be at the UW-Extension office no later than June 1 and the top two in each age category will be forwarded to Area Animal Science Day.

Livestock Judging: Judging of beef, sheep and swine will be done. A contest including retail meats competition will also be held.

Horse Activities: Youth will judge two classes of horse and complete hippology stations with

horse related questions). Any member can enter the Horse Poster Contest (original 14 x 22" poster).



Fond du Lac Co. Small Animal Fun Day!

On Saturday, May 12th, at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds Cow Palace, all youth in the Poultry, Rabbit, and Cavy (guinea pig) projects are invited to attend the Small Animal Fun Day! There will be showing and showmanship workshops, trophies, ribbons, a HUGE raffle, and prizes will be awarded for winners of our contests.

Registration is from 7:30-8:30 a.m. and the

judging will begin at 8:45 a.m. Poultry: Preregistration for poultry is required by May 1st . All poultry over 4 months of age MUST BE TESTED. It is required to bring a copy of your VS9-2 certificate with you to Fun Day. Rabbits: Pre-registration for rabbits/cavies is encouraged (but not required). Entry sheets are available online at www.fdl4h.org on the "Projects" web page or at the UW-Extension Office. Roger Moeller, a cage and supply dealer, will be at the show. You may call (920-595-0431) with special orders and he will bring them along.
