DUCATIONAL OBJECTIV

Controversies in WOMEN'S HEALTH

The last decade has seen major advances in women's health. The UCSF National Center of Excellence in Women's Health (CoE) has played a key role in this process leading innovations in clinical practice, development of new knowledge, and in professional and community education. This year's course will celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the UCSF CoE which was one of the vanguard Centers to receive this federal designation in 1996. Speakers will include nationallyrecognized faculty from UCSF who have made major contributions in women's health over the last decade and who continue to lead the field.

Designed for family physicians, internists, gynecologists, nurses, pharmacists and all others involved in providing quality health care for women, the course will provide a practical update on comprehensive range of common but controversial issues in women's health. Emphasis will be placed on new developments in preventive care for women, issues in reproductive health, and clinical strategies in the diagnosis and treatment of common gynecologic and medical disorders of women. A keynote address will reflect on the progress of the last decade and collective aspirations for the next one. An audience response system will facilitate questions and discussion. A complete course syllabus will be provided for all participants.

The course is presented by the UCSF Division of General Internal Medicine and the Center of Excellence in Women's Health in close collaboration with the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Sciences and is sponsored by the Office of Continuing Medical Education, University of California, San Francisco.

An attendee completing this course should be able to describe:

- · Current recommendations for prevention and early detection of breast and cervical cancer in women with diet, vaccines, pap tests, genetic testing, and diagnostic imaging;
- · Current strategies for prevention, recognition and treatment of CAD in women;
- Current strategies for effective family planning
- Management of common office problems in women's health including abnormal pap smears, menopause, endometriosis, incontinence, obesity, metabolic syndrome, vaginitis and sexually transmitted diseases;
- · Current approaches to common problems seen in elderly women including dementia and osteoporosis; Current recommendations for the management of anxiety disorders, depression, social phobia, and premenstrual dysphoric
- New evidence supporting the use of alternative therapies in women's health;
- The impact of HIV and the AIDS epidemic on women's health;
- · Current understanding of the impact of gender on brain function.


