Course Description

Presented by the University of California, San Francisco School of Medicine, this course stresses antepartum and intrapartum assessment and clinical management in obstetrics. On the first day, various aspects of prenatal diagnosis, genetics, antepartum conditions and maternal complications are covered. The second day is largely devoted to the recent 2008 recommendations fetal heart rate interpretation, and management of fetal heart rate patterns. The third day continues with discussions of potential complications of pregnancy and their management.

The course is appropriate for physicians, midwives, obstetrical nurses and trainees.
