### RULES OF EVIDENCE: FRE V. CEC

In 1967, California became the first U.S. jurisdiction to codify its law of evidence with the implementation of the California Evidence Code (CEC). The 40th anniversary of the CEC coincides with its inclusion on the California State Bar Examination. The state's bar exam currently only tests on the Federal Rules of Evidence (FRE), which has been adopted by a majority of states.

The symposium will examine the differences between the CEC and the FRE. Topics covered will include hearsay, character evidence and impeachment, testimony of experts, and issues relating to relevance, competence and witness statements. Differences in California and federal rulemaking will also be addressed by leading scholars of the law of evidence from California and across the country.
