songs MUST be memorized by this Monday (NO sheet music on the risers): Holly Jolly Holidays; Carol of the Bells; Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree; Merry Christmas, Darling; Jamaican Noel, Jingle Bells, Mary Had a Baby, Rise Up Shepherd and Follow; and Silent Night.

We gave ourselves grades on some of the songs from Monday's rehearsal. Use these as a guide for what to practice most between now and Monday.

Carol of the Bells, Grade= D+ I sent a YouTube link for a great recording to practice with. Use it! That final key change has the potential to be very impressive. We need to nail it.

Merry Christmas, Darling, Grade= C. We still don't know all of the words. Leads, double check the rhythms of the melody. Trio, I need to hear more of a difference between a "doo" syllable an da "doot" syllable. Basses, so proud of how you are singing the downbeat words when you are alone. They

are so elegant. On p. 3, measure 35, we agreed to not breathe and to make the word "I've" a

quarter note.

Rise Up Shepherd, Grade= B-. Ray asked me why we didn't speed up the sections on his verse. The answer- we started too fast. In order to speed up, we need to start a little more slowly. I know the "doos" are boring, but find a way to make them exciting. Pull them like taffy and add a little crescendo to each one. Remember, we do not breathe after the 4th doo each time. When the chorus comes in singing our verse with the words, you'd better look darn excited about following that star.

Holly Jolly Holidays, Grade= B.

We need more personality on the Holly Jolly sections so that the middle Home for the Holidays section will contrast with us standing and singing sincerely. We are singing the rhythm wrong on p. 3, measure 44. "For the" is straight quarter notes, not dotted quartereighth. In the Holly Jolly sec-

tions, make gestures to express the following words or phrases: I don't know if there'll be snow; have a cup of cheer; say hello to friends; kiss her once for me; the tag (let the audience know when it's your special part Basses- Tis the Season, Leads-Oh there's no place, Tenors- some-body waits for you.

Mary Had a Baby- something was off with the tag. Please review it.

Most of last Monday's rehearsal was spent working on group songs. We welcomed the ladies of MCC, Caroline on the flute, Dave as our narrator, and David on the organ. Here are some notes about our ensemble songs.

Most Wonderful Time- while we can't sing softly because we won't be heard over the organ and orchestra, we will try to sing loud and less loud in this song. Loud on the refrains and less loud on the B sections "There'll be parties for hosting... (especially) scary ghost stories.." PLEASE practice notes on p. 5 of the vocal music, measures 192 & 193 for the chords on "long ago."

Do You Hear What I Hear- What's the hardest note of the scale to sing in tune? The 3rd note. 1-2-3. Guess how the verses start on this song? "Said the night" (1-2-3). The ladies are singing the 3rd note higher than you are. Let's show them we can sing that note higher and in tune. If you

don't have melody on this song, sing softer. Raise your soft palate high enough for the highest note of "Do You hear what I hear?" on the breath before the phrase. It's nearly impossible to raise the palate in the middle of a phrase. You must plan ahead. You NAILED this in the final verse. On p. 6, we are in unison for "the child, the child, sleeping in the night." We need to soften for the unison AND we need to soften again because the child is supposed to be SLEEPING. So two dynamic levels down for that phrase.

Adeste- 1st verse will be at a quicker tempo. Be ready for it! We will sing longer phrases so drop a syllable and take a breath in the phrase but do not breathe after four measures. We will take a breath between each "O come let us adore him." When we sing the word "Father", stress-release the word (louder and Fa and softer on ther).

12 Days of Christmas- we have made a cut to this song. Please mark your music accordingly. After verse six, we will jump to 12. In my music, that means cut from m. 73 on p. 5 to m. 158 in p. 10. Be careful on verse 1. That partridge is the only one that doesn't have an "and."

Are you still with me? Good. This Monday is just us, no visitors or other groups. Let's use it to our advantage and really clean these songs. Let's make them all earn a grade of A. In order to achieve this, I need you to work and practice at home this week. Write the lyrics down. It's a good exercise for re-

Board Briefs



Here are some notes from the board meeting held Nov. 21.

Secretary: **Bob Nicodem** - Minutes from previous meeting were approved Treasurer: **Tony Tumea** - Financial reports were presented and reported that while revenues from the Christmas show are close to the budgeted amounts, the costs are more than budgeted, particularly printing and advertising. Credit card and Tix.com fees are already over budget. Tony noted that we need to clear \$30,000 to cover our expenses for the year, mainly rent, director's salary and music.

President: Jay Bentz reported that Don Davia will be working on setting up an installation & awards night for Monday, Jan. 13. He also noted that the best way to have more fun in rehearsal is for everyone to spend more time at home learning and practicing the music.

Christmas Show: Jon Hoekema reported that the planning activities are going well. He and Dave Martin met with the Tivoli and went through the script to set up lighting and sound cues. The partnership with the Tivoli is now working very well. Although we added Roxy quartet, we're still working hard to keep the show to 2 hours and 10 minutes in length (including intermission). We're learning to use tix.com better but a few

problems have popped up that are being worked on. There is no accurate way to track sales by group (e.g. Midwest Crossroad) that would allow us to base part of their fee on "commission". We are working with a group that does ushering and will have their people covering all the aisles at the 3 shows. Their only fee is the ability to sit in the back during the performance. The Christmas show committee will be meeting on January 11 to brainstorm ideas for the 2014 show. Ticket sales, expenses, and many other issues will also be discussed.

Music and Performance: Don Kaap talked about the DG library performance, along with ways to talk to men to recruit them. We are planning to do Singing Valentines and will plan on including the Valentine songs during rehearsals so guys learn them. This spring we will be having a cabaret instead of a regular show, the date is tentatively set for Sunday, April 6. There was a substantial discussion about learning tracks and how to get guys to learn music and new members up to speed as efficiently as possible. Dec. 19 is the music team's annual planning meeting.

Development/Membership: **Bill Stob** said we need to plan special activities for guest nights, the first of which will be January 20.

Other: Barbershopper of the Month was selected.

SUPERCHARGING THE WEST TOWNS CHAPTER!! - Part 1

As promised, from my class at Harmony University this summer, here is a somewhat condensed version of the presentation made by the society to help chapters recruit and keep new members. Please read through this and try it out!! We have some excellent opportunities to meet new people and invite them to our BIG new member night coming up in January.

There are several segments to the presentation, the basic plan, the Cattle Call, The Invitation, The Follow UP call.

There are 8 basic steps:

- Get out in the public and SING!!!!
- 2. Do your best to incorporate the Cattle Call Alternative during the performance.
- 3. Personally engage someone after the performance and invite them.
- 4. Get THEIR information! Have a card they can fill out their name and phone number and give back to you. Or at least bring paper and pencil so you can take notes.
- 5. Call and follow up!
- When they show up, make them feel welcome. Find out who they are and their experience. Explain the typical rehearsal plan. What a "Tag" is, etc.
- 7. Get them up on the risers when it makes sense for them.

- Some people may be intimidated to get up right away, and others might be upset to have to wait. You have to find their comfort level. Team them up with a singing buddy who can help them along.
- 8. DO NOT bring up joining in the first few visits. (We do have information if THEY ask for it.. don't bring it up if they don't.)

The Cattle Call

The "Cattle Call" Alternative should be mentioned during every appropriate show.

"Ladies and gentlemen, I just wanted to mention something. Did you know that 70% of these men on the stage tonight did not sing in front of people before joining this group, and that the majority of them can't read music? These are guys that just sing around the house.. and look at how much fun they are having now performing for you! (Optional line) And aren't they doing a great job?!!

What you've done is make singing very approachable with everyone that sings around the house. And now they are thinking... "Hey, I could do that!"

You now have people watching the show looking for ways to join, rather than not to join! As they begin to relate with someone on stage, they are already beginning to pick out their riser buddy!
