Subjects for the seminar

1) Organization of Information: Seeing the Patterns

Research material can be organized many ways. However, most of us do not know either the methods or how to get started. In this lecture Michael discusses various ways to organize your information, with the hope that previously unnoticed trends become apparent. Session begins with a brief discussion of family group charts and continues into Chronologies and other less often used charts and organizational methods.

2) Note taking, Abstracting, and Extracting

Have you ever made a research trip, and when you got home you found that you missed recording some important information? In this lecture Michael discusses procedures for note taking, abstracting, and extracting, along with a discussion of what type of source you are using.

3) Brick Wall from A to Z

This session addresses the problem that we all face at some time during our research. Using an alphabetical listing of "brick wall breakers" will give you a good chance of breaking down that wall that has your research stopped.

4) Pre-1850 Census Records: "Analyzing and reconstructing the family Structure"

As you know, Census records prior to 1850 only list the head of household by name and numerical listing of other members of the household. This lecture will show you techniques you can use to find their names.






