What is the Writer's Surgery?

QWC's Writer's Surgery is a member's only, writing 'check up' to help you overcome hurdles and achieve your writing goals.

You'll submit 20 pages of your work (be it a novel, short story collection, non-fiction work or poetry) for review and comment, then engage in a 90-minute conversation with your mentor, who will provide advice according to your goals.

The Writer's Surgery consultation is focused on you as a writer – rather than just your writing. Your session will address any questions about writing you may have, discuss your ideas and intentions and gain practical advice on technique and industry practice.

Members are invited to join their mentor via Skype or phone, or face-to-face in QWC's offices.

Booking your appointment

Please fill out the attached booking form listing your sessions in order of preference (1-3) with the mentor you think will suit you best. On receipt of a 20-page sample, a one page synopsis and a completed application form, a QWC staff member will be in touch to confirm your appointment. **Applications must be received no less than 10 working days before the elected consultation date**. The mentor will assess your sample and will then meet with you for a 90-minute consultation, in person at QWC offices, or over the phone, to discuss your work.

Please note: this is neither an editing service nor a manuscript appraisal service. The Writer's Surgery is directed to the author, not the manuscript. The consultant, while referring to a sample of writing provided, does not read the entire manuscript. The service is geared toward allowing the writer to complete their project according to their goals by creating awareness of industry practice, procedure, and statistical realities.
