Day 1: Today we arrive in Seattle and begin our Scenic Wonders tour. Upon arriving we will enjoy lunch on our own at Pike's Market then take a tour of Seattle's highlight attractions. Tonight, our dinner is included at a local restaurant before we check-in at our Portland hotel for a two-night stay.

Meal—(D) Overnight-Portland

Day 2: Today we follow the footsteps of Lewis and Clark as we tour the Columbia River Gorge and enjoy an exciting day of touring in the Portland area. We begin with a visit to the American International Rose Test Gardens with varieties from across the globe. We will drive the Mt. Hood Loop to the beautiful Columbia River Gorge, seeing Mt. Hood, Oregon's highest peak, and Multnomah Falls, tumbling some 620 feet. We visit Bonneville Dam and see its fishlocks and ladders. Our drive takes us to the impressive Timberline Lodge for an included dinner.

Day 3: This morning we continue south through Salem, Oregon's capital city. We drive by the Capitol Building, a beautiful marble structure of modern design. Then we travel through Eugene, the second largest metropolitan area in Oregon. Our route takes us through the Willamette National Forest and over 5,128-foot Willamette Pass. Cradled at the crest of the Cascade Range, we find the jewel known as Crater Lake. We enjoy another delicious dinner together tonight before we check-in at our hotel.

DAY 4: After breakfast, we explore Crater Lake, formed nearly 6,600 years ago. We travel through Medford, known for its orchards, creameries and vineyards, on our way to Gold Beach for our overnight stay. Gold Beach is a small Oregon town where the Rogue River meets the Pacific Ocean.

Day 5: A cruise up the spectacular Rogue River will take us into Oregon's rugged wilderness to see bald eagles, cormorants, seals and blue herons. A boxed lunch will be included with our exciting jet boat excursion. Our final destination today is Coos Bay, the international port that ranks among the world's largest wood products exporting centers. We visit the House of Myrtlewood, where many different myrtlewood products are produced. Watch the manufacturing process, from log to the finished product, and then we have another great dinner included before we check into our hotel for the evening.

Overnight—Florence Meals—(B, L, D)

Day 6: This morning we visit the Oregon Sand **Dunes National Recreation Area** where we get on a dune buggy for a thrilling ride over the miles of sand. The natural diversity of Oregon Dunes NRA makes it a natural home to a wide range of plant and animal species, including the Snowy Plover, an endangered shorebird, osprey, egret, river otters and bald eagles. Our next stop is Sea Lion Caves, a privately owned wildlife preserve and bird sanctuary and America's largest sea cave and the year-round home of the Steller sea lion. Dinner is included this evening at the Rheinlander German Restaurant.

beautiful wonders of Oregon comes to an end all too soon. After breakfast our motorcoach will take us to the airport for our flight home. Our Christian Tours tour director will travel with us. Meal—(B)
