Independent Reading – Mystery Puzzle Piece Book Project

Overview: Mystery stories are written puzzles made for a reader. To complete this project, you will make a nine-piece puzzle that gives the reader clues about the story you have read independently.

Directions: For this assignment you will need any or all of the following materials: oaktag (poster board paper), construction paper, computer and computer paper, puzzle pieces, colored pencils or markers. Using these materials, you will create a nine-piece puzzle based on the events in the book you read. Carefully follow the instructions below to complete your puzzle. Use the rubric to help you assess yourself so that you will earn the maximum amount of points possible. This is the same rubric I will use to assess your project.

Instructions for Puzzle Pieces:

- **Piece #1** Creatively display the title and author of the book as well as your name and class number. Include a picture (not a picture of the book's cover as found online).
- **Piece #2** Tell about the protagonist, antagonist, and any secondary characters in your book. Include a picture of the main character as well.
- Piece #3 Thoroughly describe the setting of the book. Include a picture of the setting.
- **Piece #4** Identify the type of conflict and explain the conflict descriptively. Include a picture.
- **Piece #5** Thoroughly describe the rising action. Include a picture.
- Piece #6 Thoroughly describe the climax of the book. Include a picture.
- Piece #7 Thoroughly describe the resolution. Include a picture.
- **Piece #8** Explain why this book is a mystery.
- **Piece #9** Rate this mystery on a scale of 1 5. Explain why you gave it that rating.

Finally, assemble your pieces on a large piece of oaktag. Decorate the puzzle in any way that aligns with the ideas found within the story.

Note: Make your puzzle attractive.
It just might be displayed in Eagle Landing later this year.
