# This week's Focus is on: The School Improvement Plan (SIP)

Prior to opening Roseacres, it was important to establish the key priorities for the school. These are:

- 1. To open the new school, establish a governing body, and to develop positive relationships with parents and local community groups.
- 2. To develop effective systems, processes, procedures, and policies that are fit for purpose and are compliant with statutory requirements.
- 3. To create exciting and enriching topics, that deliver the requirements of the new National Curriculum.
- 4. To develop assessment systems and processes that align to the curriculum, providing useful summative and formative assessment, which meet statutory requirements.

We have already achieved some aspects, such as establishing a governing body. However, with national priorities such as a new curriculum and assessment framework, as well as many other areas, which we would like to develop at Roseacres, there is still much to be done. It will take some time, years in some respects, but all the time we are making improvements for our children, forming a legacy that all our children, families and community will be proud of.

# **Code of Conduct for Pupils**

As part of the consultation for the school improvement plan, in developing our core aims and values for our school, we consulted with all pupils in order to develop a code of conduct. By having this in place, we hope to guide and support the children, to think about the choices they make; being aware these will have a consequence upon others. As an individual we are also part of a community. We all have a responsibility to keep our self and others safe and happy, so that in school we are all able to learn and make progress. The language we use is age appropriate, so the children can understand and respond to it.

# **Polite Reminders:**

#### Safety:

Just a reminder for parents/carers/ visitors to use the path when entering or leaving the site. Also if driving, not to use the front of the school to reverse or turn in, as this is a very busy place for children and adults crossing. Many thanks for your co-operation with this.

#### **Attendance:**

Attendance/sickness absence: If your child is off school, please ring on the first day of absence. Also, write a letter with the dates and reason and give this to the office/teacher on the first day back to school. If your child has had sickness, diarrhoea or both, then they should be clear for 48 hours from the last episode, before returning to school.

Medical appointments: Routine dental and eye appointments should be booked outside of the normal school day. Hospital or specialist appointments will differ. Therefore, we do request that parents bring the appointment card or letter to school, so that we are able to place a copy of this on your child's file.

**Punctuality:** The gates and class doors open at 8.45am each day (15 mins early) to allow for a flow of parents/carers to drop off their children. We would kindly ask that parents leave the classrooms promptly, so that the day's learning can begin. Children arriving after this time will need to be signed in by their parent/carer, giving a valid reason for the lateness., as opposed to just putting 'late'. We are required by law to have this in place and to request this. Thank you very much for your co-operation and understanding.

#### **Learning News Autumn 2nd Half Term**

**Rec Topic:** Reception are learning about colour, light and pattern. This week the children have been exploring colour mixing, producing colour sums by mixing two primary colours (red, blue, yellow) to make a new one (secondary colour). Next week they'll be learning about repeat pattern.

Y1/2 Topic: The children are learning about their local area. This week, the children learnt about measures in maths. They used a trundle wheel to measure the length of the playground. They are learning to estimate and measure accurately, using appropriate measures and equipment, such as a ruler for millimetres/ centimetres, a meter ruler, and a trundle wheel.

# **Children's Challenge**

**Rec:** To continue singing the rhyme learnt, last week: 'Five little men in a flying saucer' (subtraction). To continue the maths learning on 3D shapes. Please help your child to recognise and name common 3D shapes at home or in the environment, e.g. cylinder (post box), cube, cuboid, cone, sphere (ball).

Y1/2: The children have been learning about information books. To help with this learning focus, they need to find out some facts about Takeley, so they can create an information book next week

**All the children** are learning the songs for the **nativity performance**, so they can continue to sing and practise these at home. Additionally, some children will soon be given a reading. They should practise, saying this out loud at home. If they can learn the reading off by heart, even better! We will be asking for your help in getting the costumes together for your child. A separate letter will follow.
