From the Pastor's Desk

Some time ago a preaching contest was held at Yale Divinity School. The winning sermon dealt with the three attitudes towards possessions demonstrated in Jesus' Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 20:25-37. The three attitudes were:

Thieves: What's <u>yours</u> is <u>mine</u> and I'll <u>take</u>. Levite & Priest: What's <u>mine</u> is <u>mine</u> and I'll <u>keep</u>. Good Samaritan: What's <u>mine</u> is <u>yours</u> and I'll <u>share</u>.

With such good three points, it's easy to see how that sermon won the contest. But someone's attitude is missing in this sermon. What about the attitude of the innkeeper?

The Good Samaritan entrusted the care of the wounded man to the innkeeper, and, as well as giving the innkeeper some money when he handed over the injured man, he promised to pay the innkeeper for any future expenses.

Perhaps the fourth attitude towards possessions, as reflected by the innkeeper, is most important of all:

Innkeeper: What's mine has been given to me to use in service to those for whom God cares.

When we think about our possessions, no matter how hard-earned, we have to realize that we would have nothing if not for the combine blessings of health, education, upbringing, and social structure which have allowed us to succeed. Hopefully none of us have the attitude of the thieves or the Levite or Priest concerning possessions. When given the opportunity, I trust that we will all express the attitudes of the Good Samaritan and the innkeeper.

As the month of Thanksgiving comes, let us be thankful for all that God has blessed us with in the past which have enabled us to have the money and possessions we have today. Using what God has blessed us with to serve those for whom God cares makes our lives full of meaning, joy, and peace.

God cares for those in the world who have little of this world's goods and services. Our tithes and offerings to the church are important because this enables the church to meet pressing needs among "the least of this world." May we be like the Good Samaritan by empowering the innkeepers, the church, to help the truly needy.

Financial Report for November 2013 Newsletter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have been very blessed to have received a bequest from Marge Cox. The total amount is \$381,458.25. About half of that was received in the month of October, so doesn't show on the end of September financials. Your Church Council voted to use this money for tithing first, and then were allocated of the remainder to various committees within the church for them to specifically allocate. Except for some prudent uses the funds to cover essential facility needs and retaining some for very rainy days, the intent is to use the funds mostly for ministries and outreach missions to do what God commands us to do in the place He has put us. We have excluded these funds from the Operating Budget and put them into a special category called "Board Restricted". In this way, we can track the usage of the funds and the remainder can be reallocated if the Church Council chooses.

The Tithe Fund was used to pay off the unbudgeted apportionments. The remainder of this fund plus the receipts in October will be allocated evenly among the Russo Prison Ministry, Manatee Religious Services (MRS), and the Pastor's Discretionary Fund – this will be a little more than \$6,000 each. The first two are missions that we routinely support with our quarter drills and with other giving from time to time. MRS provides a valuable service for churches in Manatee County by vetting people who are in deep need of short-term financial support. They then ask a church in the vicinity of the people to step in and help financially – maybe pay an electric bill or a monthly rent bill – and, most importantly, to minister to the people showing them God's great love for them through His church. Our Pastor will use his discretionary fund to help those MRS sends our way and to help those in need in our congregation also. The use of these funds is discretionary by the Pastor, but he has voluntarily asked that two others act as a team with him so that a vote of two out of three will be needed for disbursement. The Finance Committee approved this arrangement and it will be added to our procedures.

The Finance Fund was used to pay off the copier lease which had been rolled-over a number of times in the past so was exorbitant relative to the value of the copier. We now own the copier. The remainder of this fund plus the additional receipts in October will be held in reserve for a rainy day.

For the quarter drill in September, \$289 was received which is designated for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

Now for our Operating Budget status...

Please remember, that the Marge Cox bequest is **not** meant to be used to cover the Operating Budget. We, the church, are called to support our operations by our prayers, our presence, <u>our gifts</u>, and our service. We are behind in our pledged giving a little and behind in our extra giving to cover the budget SHORTFALL, but ahead in non-pledged and loose plate giving. Coupled with lower expenses than expected, our actual income is \$6,674 above our actual expenses.

Trustees Report Nov 2013

The trustees have a surplus refrigerator that was not working for a while, but has been repaired. They would like to sell it or donate it to a good home. If you are interested, or know someone who is, contact Pastor Gary.

The Trustee Committee has voted to remodel the men's and women's bathrooms to include installation of two handicap approved toilets in the women's and new grab rails in both bathrooms. Old wallpaper will be removed, some ceiling tile replaced, and new lighting installed.

New outdoor power equipment has been purchased to replace items stolen from the maintenance shed last year. Two wood step ladders have been replaced with fiberglass units for safety reasons. The sidewalks leading to the main entrance and to Banner Hall have been repaired after damage from tree roots.

A locksmith has been hired to repair or adjust all exterior doors to assure that they close and lock properly.

Ron Luke and several volunteers have been making repairs to the irrigation system. The "geysers" that were such a visible sign of the need for repairs, have been repaired. This work is ongoing as there a lot of sprinkler heads and it takes time to service them.

Every time the Rev. Jim Russo talked about his Christmases in prison, big tears rolled down his face as he said "I couldn't give anything to my children." He also knew that there wasn't enough money at home to get gifts for them. That's why Mama Mia's Love Train was started. Jim believed that every little girl should have a baby doll that cried "Mama". Little boys needed a car or truck they could push along the floor while saying "varoom". Jim also knew that because of a simple toy, Christmas miracles occur. Chaplains have told us that as soon as the toys arrive a 'calm' seems to come over the prison. Then there is the love of parent and child. Because of today's economy, we know that this will probably be the only gift these forgotten children will receive. Just think of the joy of the child who had a Christmas wish fulfilled with one very special toy! Most of all, God is there, Emmanuel, God is with! We are anticipating the need for a least 7,000 toys this year! Ruth Circle




