Guidelines for making a referral to Skills Development Scotland for an Activity Agreement assessment

Skills Development Scotland (SDS) aims to provide support to young people aged primarily 15 – 18 (at point of transition) to improve their employability and to address barriers to progression into education, training and employment opportunities. SDS has been tasked with carrying out assessments to ascertain whether or not individual young people are eligible to progress onto an Activity Agreement.

Eligibility Criteria:

The young person may fall into one or more of the following target groups:

- 1. looked after and accommodated children (LAAC)/Care leavers
- 2. the young homeless
- 3. young offenders
- 4. young people with physical disabilities (includes sensory impairment visual and hearing)
- 5. young people with learning disabilities and / or difficulties:
 - 5.1 emotional and behavioural difficulties
 - 5.2 learning disabilities (A lifelong condition that starts before adulthood affecting a person's intellectual development and sometimes their physical development)
 - 5.3 autistic spectrum disorders (e.g. autism, aspergers)
 - 5.4 other learning difficulties (e.g. dyslexia, dyspraxia)
- 6. young people with mental health problems
- 7. young people with drug / alcohol problems

and / or meet one or more of the following criteria:

- willing to engage with a trusted professional to identify barriers to progression and access support to address barriers to progression into education, training and employment
- willing to engage in individual or group activities developed and delivered by partner agencies to improve employability
- have limited involvement with other agencies offering support to address barriers

If the young person falls into any of these categories then they may be eligible for help and support under the Activity Agreement programme.
