#### QUEENS BIRTHDAY WEEKEND WORSHIP CHARACTER: PERSONAL DISCIPLESHIP I CORINTHIANS: 13:1-13

Today we arrive at the end of a six week series on Worship Character. It has been an interesting journey with a few twists and turns on the way... but what a feast it has been.

The input from Paul Sparks from the USA was a left of field bonus with his deeply integrated community mission of the practice of 'Faithful Presence'. Added to that was the stunning witness of Lili in her journey of contrasts in worship, prayer and the character of God rediscovered in hospitality, welcome and the grace of Christ.

As we close today I want to share the impact that Chris Sharpe's encouragement of backing singers had on me last week as we heard from Sheri Gould featured on 'worshiptraining.com'

While Sheri addressed song leaders and backing singers I felt she actually addressed all worshippers. Here are some gems" The place you discover the kind of worshipper you are is in your own private space - it's how you get to know who you are as a person before you get in front of others.

Don't put on something false. You need to bring the real you ! People are watching you even when you are not on the platform - if you are not on the platform where are you as a worshipper ? You are always 'on' - authentically no matter if you are up front or not. Others are noticing the 'worshipping you' no matter if you are leading or not."

Sheri and Chris reminded us that worship is for an audience of one. It is not about 'me, me, me' and that whether we are part of the 'upfront' team or not we are in fact all in the 'upfront' team before the Lord. All of us who walk in the Way of Christ are, despite our different voices, characters and personal likes and dislikes, called to be 'premier' worshippers.

As we gather out of our weeks of prayer, of noticing, of interceding, of appreciating, of celebrating God's gifts each day. So that as we gather in this multi-generational, multicultural, multi-life experienced, multi gifted, multi-learning modality, multi-socio-economic, multi-political collection we find ourselves transformed into the gathered body of Christ... into 'one loaf' of living bread.as a witness and gift to the world as a sign of 'Faith, Hope and Love'. Worship is more about character than technique, style or technology.



The following table breaks the data into various age groups How clear is the vision and direction of our church?




For you to consider:

### SAFE SCHOOLS:

There has been a lot of interest in the 'Safe Schools' materials and I have found that many people (including some teachers) have not actually been able to access the materials let alone read them.

I always concerned when strong opinions fly around in the absence of a background of credible information.

Some guiding questions might be:

1. To what extent does the Safe Schools Program, as presently described and resourced, provide sound guidance about combatting bullying at school, remembering that anyone perceived to be 'different' for reasons such as hair colour, skin colour, personality style or religious preferences, for example—not just gender—tends to be bullied?

2. To what extent does the Safe Schools Program, as presently outlined and resourced, provide adequate and balanced sex education?

3. What are the best supports, at all levels of society, which could be given to the approximately 17 out of 1000 individuals (such as Phoebe in the program) who may have abnormalities in their genetic makeup and could be described as intersex? To what extent could the Safe Schools Program be one of these supports?

# Changes to the Ministry Team:

The Ministry Team is constantly in a process of strategic change and flux. Our key conversations, discernment and decision, ongoing training and decision making rests on **4 key areas: Calling, Character, Competency and Capacity.** 

#### 4: Changes:

**1: Seniors Ministry: Marg Goddard** has moved from a voluntary capacity to a paid position from June 1. After considerable discernment, prayer and exploration Marg's role is now 2 days (1 day paid/ 1 day voluntary). She will be inducted next week June 19th.

**2:** Associate Minister (Young Adults): Drew Nicholls is being encouraged to further expand his role and formation by moving from a 3 day to a 4 day position starting in July.

**3: Worship Ministry Chris Sharpe** concluding in November– see her notice in Breaking News.

# And 4: Executive Ministry... In a season of Discernment Dave Moody has decided not seek a renewal of his position at the end of June. From Dave Moody :

Dear friends, after significant thought and prayerful reflection by Robyn and myself, I will not be seeking a renomination for the role of Executive Minister after my current employment agreement period concludes on the 30th of June 2016. I love my role and love my church, but in this season it is clear that my highest priority is my ministry to my family. You may already be aware that we have been navigating through some challenging times as an extended family for a number of months now and we have plans for an extension to the home we now share with John Mollison, which is to be completed through the second half of 2016. I need to be present and giving my best as a dad, a husband, a son-in-law and as a leader in my family.

I will continue on as Secretary until January 2017 and look forward to being an active member of my church and unfold my sense of calling in worship leading, preaching and others areas of community life as I am able.
