#### **REQUIREMENTS** for

CAMPERS: Open to campers ages 10 and up. No previous groundwork experience is required, but riders should be familiar with basic horse behavior theory and safety rules (Red Level and up).

#### **REQUIREMENTS** for

HORSES: Camp is open to mares and geldings (no stallions, please) of any breed or discipline. Horses should be trained to lead quietly with a halter before this camp, and must be capable of working calmly around other horses. Copy of

your current negative Coggins and visual health check required upon arrival. We *may* have a few horses available to borrow for the clinic on a first-come-first-served basis.

FEES: \$55 -- optional lunch/sleepover for additional fees.

PARENTS: Parents are welcome to audit the camp at no charge.

DIRECTIONS: We're about an hour north of Atlanta off of Interstate 575/Hwy 515. Map and detailed directions are available on our website. MapQuest or similar directions will work here, but better printable directions can be downloaded from our website.

STABLING for HORSES: Overnight pasture board for your horse is included at no extra charge for this camp. Call or email us to discuss options.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMODATIONS for HUMANS -- Optional supervised overnight sleepovers are available, with three meals each day, for \$25/night. You may stay for Fri or Sat nights, as you choose. Our bunkroom has three bunk beds and two folding cots; campers

should bring a sleeping bag, towels and a pillow. There are also rental cabins and hotels nearby. Call or email us for more information.

ATTIRE: We'll spend most of camp working with horses in the arena, so please wear comfortable clothing suitable for the weather. Paddock boots (or similar boots) are required. Since our outdoor arena sits on a windy hill, you'll want warm clothing, gloves, and head protection. Trust us on this one! Long hair should be tied back securely, and jewelry is discouraged for safety reasons.

MEALS: We will provide an optional lunch for an additional \$10 (see entry form); the usual fast food options are within a 5-minute drive;



you are welcome, of course, to bring your own bagged lunch. We can refrigerate or microwave as needed. Meals are provided for the sleepover option.

ABSENCE: If your camper is ill or unable to attend camp, please call us by 7:30 a.m. There is no refund after the closing date.

- safe footwear (boots are preferred)
- $\square$  sunscreen and layered clothing appropriate for weather
- ☐ snacks/plenty of water/juice
- bedding for optional sleepovers
