We sense within ourselves the potential to be loving, patient, compassionate beings. At the same time, it is often difficult to manifest these virtues in our everyday lives, as we earn a living, negotiate traffic jams, and contend with the daily challenges in relationships with those we love. Mussar clearly illuminates a path to character refinement. Mussar practice helps us cultivate good habits that guide us on our journey toward holiness.

Last year we explored the basic principles of Mussar and the application of practices to the soul trait (*middah*) of honor (*kavod*). This year we will work with a central commandment "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18) and the *middot* of love (*ahavah*) and loving kindness (*chesed*). This commandment underpins our relationships, our communities, and peace in the world.
