COMMUNITY STRIKE UPDATE

Residents of Parkview Hills are able to dispose of their garbage by taking it to the following nearby locations. The temporary dumps listed below are open 7 Days a Week from 7am to 7pm. Based on personal experience, we have found the best time to visit these locations are in the morning and on the weekend.

Stan Wadlow Park
Enter off of Haldon Ave. and
proceed to the Parking-Lot.

Wilket Creek Park/ Sunybrook - 1132 Leslie St. Enter off Leslie St. just north of Eglinton. Proceed to southernmost parking lot.

The Bermondsey Transfer Station is open 24 Hours a day, 7 Days a week to accept residential garbage.
