
ACS Dental Clinic




4-H Camp 2013 Coming Soon!

It's time for 4th grade students and parents to begin preparation for 4-H Camp to be held this November at the Alabama 4-H Center near Columbiana, Alabama. Mrs. Gibbs', Mrs. Goodling's and Mrs. Wall's students will attend Wed. - Fri. **November 13-15**, while Mrs. Adrian's, Mrs. Croley's and Mrs.

Reed's classes will attend Wed. – Fri. **November 20-22**. Attending camp is an experience students remember for the rest of their lives. It is a great opportunity for students to develop relationships with classmates as well as independence.

A 4-H Camp information package was sent home with your child last week. It includes necessary forms that need to be turned in, chaperone application, packing information, etc. The cost this year is \$115 which includes transportation to and from camp, outdoor instruction by an <u>outstanding</u> 4-H staff, as well as two nights lodging and six meals while at camp. Chaperone application forms are due October 2. Parents selected as chaperones will be notified next week. Payment and forms may be brought to school beginning this week. Exploring the World of Science

It's Time to Put Together Science Olympiad Teams!!

It is time to prepare for this year's Science Olympiad to be held Saturday, February 15, 2014 at Auburn University. The Elementary Science Olympiad consists of individual, pair, and team science events such as barge building, anatomy, insects, leaf and tree identification, disease diagnosis, density, pond life, pasta-mobile, estimation, structure building, egg drop, wildlife, rocks and minerals and many others, 20 events in all. Practices will be held Tuesdays, Wednesdays and/or Thursdays beginning in late October and continuing weekly through mid-February. The practice day for each student will depend upon that student's availability and event preference. Mr. Zutter will work to schedule your meeting day around Ogletree Singers, Drama Club, and Unicycle Club.

Here is the current schedule of upcoming activities and deadlines:

<u>Monday, September 30</u> - Science Olympiad Interest Forms distributed to 4th and 5th grade students <u>Friday, October 4</u> - Science Olympiad Interest Forms due to Mr. Zutter <u>Wednesday, October 16</u> – <u>Mandatory</u> Parent Information Meeting at OES, 6 pm.

Once mentors (coaches) are in place, teams will be set up, and events assigned to students as best as possible from their preferences at the first meeting. We plan on the first meeting to be in late October. <u>Parent participation as coaches has been a key to the success of OES at Science Olympiad over the last four years!!!!</u>.

October Venture Visit

This year's "Fall Focus" in Venture is "Flight". All 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classes are studying how and why things fly. Students began the unit thinking about things that fly. Then, as they began a subunit on hot air balloons, they participated in activities where they observed and wrote about properties of air, and learned about buoyancy ("floating") in water and air with help from Bill Nye the Science Guy. As the unit on hot air balloons comes to an end, students will be competing in the

OES Hot Air Balloon Challenge using balloons they have designed, tested, redesigned, retested and so on during the last two Venture classes. Next up in October and November: exploring how and why gliders and planes fly. Check with your child weekly to see what they have studied lately.

NEEDED: 1- or 2-liter plastic bottles with lids (Pepsi "shape" NOT Coke "shape") Shoeboxes with lids (adult sizes preferred)
