Putting up a new calendar really points out that more than half my year as President has already gone by. As a matter of fact we will be in Victoria selecting my successor in four months. This leads directly into:

The Nominations and Election committee has received the following nominations for 2011-2012. For President: Senator Lloyd Stockdale 20377 - Toronto, ON and for Vice President: Senator Blair Fraser 36339 - Surrey, BC.

In accordance with our Terms of Reference, candidates for President for 2011-2012 must reside east of the Manitoba/Ontario border and for Vice President West of the Manitoba/Ontario border. Both these nominations meet that requirement. Nominations will remain open until just prior to the election time at the General Assembly in Victoria.

We have also received one bid to host the 2012 Crew Meeting from the London, ON Senators. This bid meets the location requirements in the Terms of Reference.

I expect to bring back a number of registrations for the Crew Meeting, leaving even less spots available on the Navy frigate cruise.

**Senator William Koroluk 4952**

Dear Barney, at my age I need a kick to get started and thanks for the kick. My ten years in Jaycees were a pleasant experience and I was a better person for it. Listed below are some recollections of the more interesting things that I remember doing and being part of:-

As a twenty-five year old staff member of the Saskatchewan Provincial Department of Health, I was transferred to the Lloydminster District office. Lloydminster straddles the 3<sup>rd</sup> Meridian which is also the border separating Alberta and Saskatchewan. Within a short period of time while fuelling up my car at Skinner Motors, I was approached by two employees who were also active Jaycees. They welcomed me to the community and asked me to join them at the Jaycee dinner meeting. I accepted this invitation and enjoyed the meal, the fellowship and the subjects under discussion. The contents of the Creed and the role of the organization in self-betterment and community service were to my liking and I decided to pay my dues and become a member. A few weeks later I was officially inducted and received my pin from Senator Ross Smyth 37 the National President who was visiting units in Alberta.

It was the May long weekend which was an exciting period for the local membership. This was the weekend that the Grande Prairie unit was hosting the Provincial Convention. I was eager to go with several other members, packed into two cars and headed to Edmonton to share bus transportation with that unit. We climbed on board and headed north-west! At about Whitecourt, we were welcomed by black smoke and a short time later, stopped at a Police barricade. Apparently a forest fire was threatening some communities and the Police were conscripting all able-bodied men to help fight the fire. Fortunately for us our President Dick Rendek a successful lawyer was our spokesman. He was obviously very convincing since we were allowed to proceed. The convention was a whirlwind of activities and sleep was the last item on the agenda. Beyond sleep our hustling paid off since our candidate Clayton Reeves was declared the incoming Provincial President.

After a brief summer recess our New Year started and I got my feet wet in Communities activities. In time I was assigned the Chairmanship of the Community Service Committee and together with three or four other members identified the various activities that we would tackle. These were approved by our Director and with enthusiasm plus hard work we successfully finished what we started. This work had its benefits when at year-end and during the presentation of awards at the President's Ball I was honored as Outstanding Jaycee and also Chairman of the Year.

In the next few years as a member of the Executive and later as President and Past President, I attended all the Provincial Conventions. With the exception of the Medicine Hat Convention, the business sessions were interesting; however the after-hours action seemed quite tame. At the time of the Medicine Hat Convention I was already married, so went to bed early; however, it was a short night – before sunrise, the Wake up Committee appeared at our door pushing a wagon that carried a water closet (toilet). The toilet seat was raised and lo and behold the bowl was full of stale beer with pepperoni sausages swimming about! So I held my nose and after taking a deep breath gulped the stuff down. I was then given a two piece jail suit and told to report to a Jailer standing at the front door. Here all the Senators and Past Presidents were given a barn broom and at sunrise swept part of the main street. At the end of the business block we climbed onto a wagon and hayrack which was pulled by a farm tractor and were taken to a respectable restaurant for a breakfast fit for a King.

My year as Past President was a busy one since we were blessed with our first addition, a baby girl. Our Jaycee unit under the leadership of a radio personality saw impressive growth in membership and activities. We had a good club, and the decision was made that I should enter our club in competition for an Excellence Award at the Paris World Congress.

The documentation was extensive and precise, and it came as a shock when we were notified that the Lloydminster Jaycee group was selected as a runner-up to the outstanding club in the World in our population class.

Clayton Reeves 1703, a hard working Jaycee after serving in different Executive positions at Region and Provincial levels decided to enter his name as a candidate for National Office. During a three year term, he ran for the position of Vice President, then as President. I was his campaign chairman and attended conventions in Victoria, BC, Hamilton, ON and Saskatoon, SK. I traveled by train, minus a sleeper room, because of finances, and the bulky nature of the promotional material. The conventions were a fabulous experience and I met some of the nicest people. Unfortunately, Clayton was unsuccessful in filling the position of National President. It was, however, a learning experience to see how horse-trading between units was a successful means of getting votes. The July 1<sup>st</sup> banquet featured the Premier of the host Province as Guest Speaker. One Premier from Western Canada spent close to an hour complaining about the bad treatment the "feds" were giving his Province. It was rather embarrassing since we had a number of foreign Jaycees present. On another occasion the Premier of a smaller Province took time to get acquainted with the Jaycee Creed, and then spoke passionately on "That service to humanity is the best work of life". It was a speech worth listening to and he was given a standing ovation.

Toward the latter years in my Jaycee career, I chaired the Provincial Education and Youth Activities Committee and developed a Child Safety Program. I arranged with the Alberta department of Health to donate a suitable trophy to a Jaycee unit carrying out the most effective Child Safety Program. The project was well received by the units and a number of innovative ideas were developed and executed and competition was keen. The project and resultant catalogue prepared by the Medicine Hat unit was selected overall best for two years running. During the first year of the project, the Provincial Convention was also at Medicine Hat and at the time of awards presentation, I was thrilled to be selected as the Outstanding Provincial Chairman (I suspect that my involvement in the Child Safety project was a major consideration). In reviewing this selection, it was determined that the runner up for the award was one of my school mates, who was then a successful lawyer in Calgary.

Lloydminster was identified as the heavy oil capital of Canada and the fluctuating values of oil had a bearing on population swings in the community and thus membership numbers in the Jaycee unit. It was through the hard work and dedication of Jaycees such as Wilf Watson 1371, Jack Allen 2730, Clayton Reeves 1703, Axel Foght 2731 and Orville Berg 4221 (in time they were all honored with Senatorship as shown) that kept the club alive during the low times. In addition, they played a leading role in promoting membership and developing programs for newcomers who continued the good Jaycee work. (Note: This entire group mentioned above has passed away except Axel Foght who lives in Victoria, BC).

During my time on the Executive and especially as President, it was comforting to know that any and/or all of the above were only a phone call away when help was needed. Much of this advice was beneficial, not only to the Jaycees, but also to my personal and professional life.

(Note: When talking to William on the telephone in November 2010, he mentioned to me that the Alberta members should remember the story about Vodka at Jaycee conventions in their Province in the early days. He would not and did not tell me the full story, so come on you Jaycees from Alberta let us all know what happened – Barney).

Senator Edgar Simpson 61069 and I attended the wake and found the children and gran children much aware of his Jaycee affiliation. Alf was a true Londoner, born there in 1919. In the early days of radar he taught radar to the RCAF and USAF became an RAF radar specialist and in 1941 at the age of 22 arrived in Canada. His management career in electronics culminated as Managing Director of Racal Canada and Racal World. While in Arnprior, Ontario he became President of the Arnprior Junior Chamber and, as a Jaycee project he designed and built the translation equipment that was used at the Jaycee National Convention held at Montreal in 1947 – a first for any organization in Canada. Encouraged by this example and the Jaycees, Parliament soon adopted simultaneous translation. Alf was rightfully proud of his contribution to our history. Over the 30 plus years that I convened the JCI Senators in Ottawa, Alf seldom missed a gathering. He and Doris joined a tour of South Africa hosted by Edgar Simpson and myself in 1988. In Kruger Park, we jointly sat in an open Landrover while 11 lionesses walked by within seven feet of us. I have not forgotten that, against the advice of our guide, he stood up after they had just passed us. The LOUD click of the camera caused all 11 heads to turn. A scolding from the guide (and a change of underwear for all, ended the evening. Alf was a talented wonderful fun-loving family man who loved and was a credit to the Jaycees. He will be much missed by family and friends. Our sincere condolences go out to Doris and his daughter and two sons.

Trevor was lying in his favorite spot – a recliner in front of the TV and had died in his sleep from a massive heart attack, one artery being 95% blocked. He looked as though he was asleep - completely at ease and very peaceful.
