Overview

Ketchikan is named after Ketchikan Creek, which flows through the town. Ketchikan comes from the Tlingit name for the creek, Kitschk-hin, the meaning of which is unclear. Some sources define it to mean "the river belonging to Kitschk" while other accounts claim it means "thundering wings of an eagle."

Known as Alaska's first city and the "salmon capital of the world", Ketchikan's historic downtown is wedged between water and forested mountains. The downtown shopping area is delightfully built into steep hills and partly propped on wooden pilings with boardwalks and totem poles throughout.

Cruise Ship Pier Location

Ships typically dock in the **center of town**. On crowded days, some ships may be required to anchor and tender passengers into Ketchikan. Small ships sometimes dock a mile south of town, and the cruise lines will typically provide shuttles to the downtown area in this case.

- Totem Heritage Center: Established in 1976 to preserve endangered 19th century totem poles retrieved from uninhabited Tlingit and Haida village sites near Ketchikan, this charming museum also preserves and promotes the traditional arts and crafts of the Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian cultures; 601 Deermount Street, Tel.: +1 (907) 225-5901

Taxi Transportation

Downtown Ketchikan is easily walkable. For those who want to take a taxi outside of town, they are typically available in the streets.

Bus Transportation

There is a pretty comprehensive bus system in Ketchikan. The blue line will take you all the way from downtown to Totem Bight state park, for an approximate fare of \$1 per person, and the routes are well scheduled. The red line will take you down to the Saxman and Totem parks. Always check the schedule or with the driver so that you know when to get picked up for the return trip.

- Ketchikan's secondary post office box ZIP code 99950 is the highest ZIP code ever assigned in the United States.
- Ketchikan also has the world's largest collection of standing totem poles, located at three major locations: Saxman Village, Totem Bight, and the Totem Heritage Center.
- Ketchikan used to have a red light district, which was formally shuttered in 1953. You can still see remnants of the colorful history in the downtown historic neighborhoods.
