PROCEDURES FOR TRANSFER WITH F-1 VISA/STATUS

If you wish to transfer to Anne Arundel Community College, follow the steps below and submit the required documents to the Admissions office, SSVC Room 100 at the Arnold campus.

Complete application and required documentations must be submitted 30 days before the start date of the requested term. Please submit all documents at one time.

At your current school – Contact your current DSO and do the following:

1. Notify your current DSO or international student advisor of your intent to transfer to AACC.
2. Provide your current DSO the date you want your SEVIS record to be transfer released to AACC.
3. Your current DSO will set the transfer released date in SEVIS. After the release date, AACC will be able to print a new I-20 for you.

At AACC – Submit the following:

- Completed Anne Arundel Community College International (F-1) Student Admission Application form. No application fee.
- Transfer Eligibility form** signed by your current DSO or international student advisor indicating that you are in good standing and “in status” as an international student. This sheet also will include your transfer release date from SEVIS. Your release date is usually the last day of classes or the end date of your I-20. Be sure you have turned in your application and all required documents and have been accepted to AACC prior to your transfer release date.
- Photocopy of passport, visa and I-94 card or printed from the Internet.**
- Photocopy of current I-20 and all I-20s issued to you.**
- Official or certified copy of transcripts** from high school and college or university attended (must be translated by a certified English translator. If you attended another institution in the United States, you must submit your official transcript from that school.
- Official satisfactory TOEFL test score or AACC English placement test** – Visit **www.toefl.org** for TOEFL testing locations and dates. English as a Second Language (ESL) applicants are NOT required to submit TOEFL score.
- Documentation of financial support** for one academic year’s tuition and living expenses; a completed AACC Statement of Financial Resources form, and supporting documentations (official bank statements or bank letters in English, U.S. currency of at least \$26,434 if applying for associate degree program or \$18,850 if applying for ESL program (not more than 3 months old). Add \$5,000 per dependent.
- Affidavit of Support Form** (if applicable) - Affidavit of support Form I-134 if your sponsor is living in the United States. You can go to **www.uscis.gov** to print form I-134.

After the SEVIS record has been released to AACC, student must:

- Attend the mandatory international student orientation and college orientation.
- Meet with an academic advisor.
- Register for full-time classes (12-15 credits or four ESL classes).
- Pick up your new I-20.
- Purchase books and supplies necessary for classes enrolled.
- Pay your bill.
- Attend classes.

Special circumstances: Meet with your current DSO or international student advisor before submitting your application to AACC if you

- Plan to travel outside the United States before beginning of classes at AACC.
- Have an Initial I-20 (never enrolled at current school).
- Are out of status.
- Have a pending reinstatement.
- Are working on campus or on practical training.

Always review the “Instructions to Students” on your form I-20. Failure to comply with these regulations will result in the loss of your student status. It is your responsibility to meet certain obligations in order to maintain your student status. Your DSO or international student advisor is here to assist you. To maintain F-1 status at AACC, students must:

1. Maintain a valid Passport. Your passport must be valid for at least six months into the future.
2. Attend the school (AACC) you are authorized to attend (you should be attending the school that the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) last authorized for attendance -see the DHS stamp in the upper right corner of the I 20ID or the school that has processed a transfer with the USCIS).
3. Apply for extensions of program before the expiration date on the I-20. Must apply 30 days before the program end date on the I-20 form.
4. Follow proper procedures for changing from one program or educational level to another (e.g., from English as a Second Language degree to Associate's degree or Bachelor's degree).
5. Follow proper procedures for transferring from one school to another.
6. Limit on-campus employment to 20 hours a week while school is in session (full-time on-campus employment is permitted during vacation periods such as summer, as long as student was enrolled full-time the term previous and intends to be full-time the following term).
7. Refrain from off-campus employment without authorization. Limit off-campus employment (with authorization through economic hardship or part-time practical training) to 20 hours per week while school is in session.
8. Take no more than one online course per semester.
9. Report a change of address to USCIS and DSO within 10 days of the change.
10. Pursue a full course of study and **make normal progress towards the completion of the course of study:**

Full course of study and full time study are defined in the regulations as follows:

Undergraduate students/associate degree: at least 12 credit hours per term, or the equivalent (as determined by the department in the school approval process)*.

Students in ESL program must enroll 12 credit equivalent hours per term.

I have reviewed the regulations governing maintenance of visa status and have read page 2 of my I-20 form. I accept and will abide by the USCIS regulations and all Anne Arundel Community College policies concerning the federal and state F-1 student compliance guidelines.

I also certify that I know and understand the information on the Maintenance of Status Form and that I understand that it is my responsibility to notify not only the Records and Registration Office but also the Admissions Office of any change in information contained in my initial application and current records. I also understand that the information given to the Admissions Office is both accurate and complete and that I am aware of the imposed USCIS consequences for being of compliance with my F-1 status.
