Kristy Dial was teaching gourd techniques which included craving and wood burning. And the keynote speaker, Flo Hoppe, taught ridge basket weaving and three-rod wale. Her talk was a most entertaining and educational presentation on basketry and toilets!!

The Library Corner

Book Review Plaited Basketry with Birch Bark by Vladimir Yarish, Flo Hoppe, Jim Widess

Don't think you need to have a bushel of birch bark to benefit from this book! It is full of practical information on plaiting from simple to advanced. There are a number of projects very well illustrated with step-by-step photographs of the essential steps. I learned how to do diagonal plating with a rectangular base, made easy with instructions from Flo Hoppe. The cube project is not easy, but gratifying when you get it.

As for the difficulty of obtaining birch bark, gathering and preparation techniques are covered. I just went ahead with some substitute materials: folded map strips, painted watercolor paper, and my own experimental material, painted sewing interfacing. The cube project does call for something like the painted interfacing because it is strong and very flexible.

Check this book out from our library if you want to learn about plating. Borrowing books is free for members by just sending an email to the Librarian. (See Contacts on Pg. 10.)

Steal Like an Artist

Although not one of the books you'll find in our library, Peggy Wiedemann highly recommended a small, quick-read book entitled *Steal Like an Artist: 10 Things Nobody Told You About Being Creative* by Austin Kleon. She said it was a very inspiring book. Here's a review of this book found on the internet:

"Artist and poet Austin Kleon writes in an accessible, breezy, conversational shorthand. Few of his sentences run longer than eight words, and his message is simple: Learn all you can, develop a library of influences and never stop believing in your own creativity. His best advice to artists - get out of and stay out of your own way - recurs throughout the book in various forms, and Kleon offers simple, effective methods to do just that, organized as 10 creative spurs. His little sketches and profound, often humorous quotes from great thinkers and artists from across the centuries feature throughout this pocket-sized guide to unleashing your inner Picasso. While Kleon's unchanging tone can feel a bit precious, getAbstract still recommends carrying his guidebook around for boosts of creative confidence and doses of friendly, workable commonsense advice."
