# **The Nineteen Forties**

Last month I wrote about 1944, the year Bethany was founded, and listed some of the events and names in the news during that year. It was a wellreceived column, so I thought I'd cover each of the decades in Bethany's existence. This month we'll take a look at the rest of the 1940s following 1944, and I plan to cover each of the decades in subsequent issues.

In 1945 the last of the 1,050 German V-2 rockets fell on London. FDR died and was succeed by Harry Truman. The United Nations Charter was signed June 26. Mussolini was killed by Italian partisans, and Hitler committed suicide April 30. VE Day celebrated the end of the war in Europe on May 8 and Germany was divided into four zones. The first atomic bombs were dropped on Hiroshima August 6 and Nagasaki August 9. Japan surrendered and WWII ended August 14. War dead estimate: 60 million-2.5% of the world's population, the deadliest conflict in human history-plus 10 million at Nazi concentration camps. General George Patton died in a car accident. George Orwell published Animal Farm, Evelyn Waugh Brideshead Revisited, and James Thurber The Thurber Carnival. Frank Lloyd Wright unveiled his design for the Guggenheim Museum. Bela Bartok died (did you practice any of his piano exercises?), and Carousel debuted on Broadway. The Nobel Prize for the discovery of penicillin went to

Fleming, Florey, and Chain. Rocky Graziano was Boxer of the Year, and the Empire State Building was struck by a B-25 bomber.

In 1946 Churchill gave his "Iron Curtain" speech, De Gaulle resigned his Presidency, and Truman created the Atomic Energy Commission. At the Nuremberg Trials Ribbentrop, Goering, and 10 other Nazis were sentenced to death; Hess and Funk got life, and Goering committed suicide on the eve of his execution. Eugene O'Neill wrote The Iceman Cometh and Benjamin Spock wrote Baby and Child Care. Gertrude Stein, Booth Tarkington, W.C. Fields, and Damon Runyon died. William Wyler directed The Best Years of Our Lives, David Lean Great *Expectations*, and Hitchcock *Notorious*. Irving Berlin's Annie Get Your Gun was produced in New York, and so was Lerner and Loewe's Brigadoon. Popular songs were Come Rain or Come Shine, Zip-a-dee-doo-dah, and How Are Things in Gloccamorra? R.E. Byrd began his expedition to the South Pole and the US Navy began its atomic tests at Bikini Atoll. Joe Louis defended his world heavyweight title for the 23rd time. World population (in millions): China 455; India 311; USSR 194; US 140; Japan 73; West Germany 48; Italy 47; Britain 46; Brazil 45; France 40. Alabama beat USC 34-14 in the Rose Bowl, and St. Louis defeated Boston 4-3 in the World Series.

1947 saw the publication of *The Diary of Anne Frank*, Tennessee Williams' *A Streetcar Named Desire*, and Mickey Spillane's *I, the Jury*. The Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in Wadi Qumran. *Gentlemen's Agreement* won for Best Picture. Maria Callas made her debut in *Gioconda* at Verona, and Pablo Casals vowed not to perform in public as long was Franco was in power. A US airplane first flew at supersonic speeds, Thor Heyerdahl and his crew sailed a raft from Peru to Polynesia in 101 days, and Bell Laboratories scientists invented the transistor. Jackie Robinson become the first Black to sign a contract with a major baseball team. A blizzard dumped 27" of snow on NYC on December 17. Fiorello La Guardia died; Henry Ford died, leaving a fortune of \$625 million; and Al Capone died, leaving the world a better place for his departure.

1948. Gandhi was assassinated, Congress passed the Marshall Plan, and the Jewish state came into existence. Graham Greene published The Heart of the Matter, Norman Mailer The Naked and the Dead, James A. Michener Tales of the South Pacific (Pulitzer Prize), Alan Payton Cry, the Beloved Country, and Thomas Merton The Seven Storey Mountain. Films that year were *Hamlet* (the Oscar went to Laurence Olivier), The Bicycle Thief, Oliver Twist (David Lean,) and Macbeth (Orson Welles). General John Pershing, Charles Evans Hughes, D.W. Griffith, Ruth Benedict, and Babe Ruth died. Joe Louis retired from the ring after fighting 25 title bouts since 1937, Cleveland won the World Series 4-2 over Boston, "Citation" won the Triple Crown (fourth Kentucky Derby win for Eddie Arcaro), and Michigan (Go Blue!) defeated USC 49-0 (Go Blue!) in the Rose Bowl (Go Blue!).

In 1949, Vietnam was established as a state, the Apartheid program was instigated in South Africa, the Berlin Airlift ended after 277,264 flights, Nehru became Prime Minister of India, and 11 US Communists were found guilty of conspiracy to overthrow the government. George Orwell wrote *Nineteen Eighty-Four*, T.S. Eliot *The Cocktail Party*, Arthur Miller *Death of a Salesman* (Pulitzer Prize), and Eleanor Roosevelt *This I Remember*. Popular songs were *So in Love*, *Riders in the Sky*, *Diamonds are a Girl's Best Friend*, and *Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer*. "South Pacific" took Broadway by storm, so *Bali Hai, Some Enchanted Evening*, and *I'm in Love with a Wonderful Guy* were, too. New York (AL) beat Brooklyn (NL) 4-1 in the World Series. Composer Richard Strauss died.

Through it all, God was in control, He expanded His kingdom, and He blessed His people.
