#### Afternoon: 1,000 Vs and T.J.s at the White House

- 3:00 With permits in hand, up to 1,000 people representing all 50 states, and masked and costumed as either "V" or Thomas Jefferson (the choice is theirs), will congregate at Lafayette Park across from the White House, where they will wait in silent vigil for up to one hour for a person representing President Bush to address the People, letting the People know when the Executive Department of the United States will respond to the Petitions for Redress of the following constitutional torts (all Petitions would have been served by March 1, 2007):
  - 1. The IRAQ Resolution and The War Powers Clauses of the Constitution.
  - 2. The Federal Reserve System and the Money Clauses of the Constitution.
  - 3. The USA PATRIOT Act and the Privacy Clauses of Constitution.
  - 4. The Income Tax and the Tax Clauses of the Constitution
  - 5. Immigration Laws and the Faithfully Execute Clause of Article II of the Constitution.
  - 6. Open Borders and the 10<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution.
  - 7. Sealed Oaths and Affirmations in Support of Warrants, Warrantless Wiretapping, National ID Cards, Un-verifiable Voting, RFID Chips and the 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution.
  - 8. The Absence Of Organized State Militias and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment to the Constitution.
  - 9. Gun Registration and Gun Permit Laws and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment to the Constitution.
  - 10. The Absence of Cameras In The Courtroom and the 6<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution.
  - 11. The North American Union and the Treaty Clause of the Constitution.
  - 12. The Absence of Choices in Healthcare and the 4<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Amendments to the Constitution.
