August 4, 2010

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of Vista Irrigation District was held on Wednesday, August 4, 2010, at the offices of the District, 1391 Engineer Street, Vista, California.

1. CALL TO ORDER

President Williams called the meeting to order at 8:32 a.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Directors present: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Williams, and MacKenzie.

Directors absent: None.

Staff present: Roy Coox, General Manager; Lisa Soto, Secretary of the Board; Eldon Boone, Assistant General Manager; Don Smith, Director of Water Resources; Brian Smith, Director of Engineering; Brett Hodgkiss, Administrative Services Manager; and Marian Schmidt, Administrative Assistant. General Counsel Joel Kuperberg was also present.

Other attendees: Jeff Sykes and Juanita Hayes of SDG&E; Pat Houston of Kennedy Jenks.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Director MacKenzie led the pledge of allegiance.

4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A. Treasurer's Report

See staff report attached hereto. The Board noted and filed this informational report which included an investment summary, a detailed security listing, and a five-year cash flow forecast, which indicated the District's investments are sufficiently liquid to meet anticipated cash flow needs.

6.C. Grant of Easement to San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E)

See staff report attached hereto. Mr. Jeff Sykes provided background regarding the easement. General Manager Roy Coox interjected that SDG&E proposes to use part of their easement for a helicopter landing pad for a project to replace power poles over the next several months. He added that staff has been in discussion with SDG&E concerning this to be sure any liability issues are covered. The Board received clarification as to whether or not SDG&E would need additional land outside the easement for anchors, to which Mr. Sykes responded that the switch from wooden poles to metal would eliminate the need for anchors. The Board received clarification concerning the need for CEQA documentation for this project from General Counsel Kuperberg, who responded that in this case, the District is merely granting an easement to maintain an existing use, so there would be no CEQA requirements for VID.

10-08-90 Upon motion by Director MacKenzie, seconded by Director Vasquez and unanimously carried, the Board of Directors approved Item 6.C of the Consent Calendar granting an easement to SDG&E to construct, operate and maintain electrical and communication facilities on the Warner Ranch.

Mr. Jeff Sykes and Ms. Juanita Hayes of SDG&E left the meeting after this item.

7. DIVISION REPORTS

See staff report attached hereto.

There was no discussion on this item.

8. VISTA FLUME REPLACEMENT PROJECT

See staff report attached hereto.

Mr. Coox stated that this item was presented to update the Board on the status of the flume replacement project going forward, now that the pilot project has been completed successfully. Director of Engineering Brian Smith stated that the next hurdle will be to make a determination that the project is exempt from CEQA and file a Notice of Exemption. Mr. Smith said that the plan is to use the remainder of the year to design the next phase of the replacement project, and begin construction next fall in 2011. Mr. Smith handed out a map of the overall project to each of the Board members as a visual aid in the discussion (attached hereto as Exhibit A). Director MacKenzie asked how the project will be phased, and how many phases are anticipated. Mr. Smith responded that the current plan is to start upstream at the Escondido/Vista Filtration plant, and work downstream. Mr. Smith said that staff is planning to propose the next phase to be the first three benches—Jack Creek, Tunnel, and Big Tunnel. Beyond that, the plan is somewhat up in the air as to how much of the flume to tackle each year until the entire project is complete.

The Board discussed different ideas of how to complete the entire project—how many phases, over how many years, and how best to pay for it. Assistant General Manager Eldon Boone stated that financially, the project has been planned to be constructed over the next ten years, adding that the cost of this project was included in the rate model at the time of the tiered rate increase. Mr. Coox said that the wild card for the project is the State loan for which the District has apparently been approved. If the District decides to accept this loan, it could affect the timing of the project. In the meantime, staff is moving forward with the environmental documentation that will be needed before the project can begin.

Mr. Smith updated the Board on where the District stands with the State loan, stating that his understanding is that VID has been approved. He said that the next step is for the State to issue to VID a "Notice of Application Acceptance" which states conditions which will be placed on the loan. Once VID receives this letter, the District will have a year to make a decision on whether or not to accept the loan. Mr. Boone said that the interest rate on the loan won't be known until the letter is received. Once the interest rate is known, it can be decided if the loan is worth accepting, based on the interest rate offered.

The Board discussed the next phase, and future phases, and the possibility of benefiting from economy of scale by tackling larger portions of the project at once. Pat Houston of Kennedy/Jenks discussed procurement issues and options with the Board. Mr. Coox stated that staff's plan is to come

back with a proposed design scope of work and the environmental documents for the Board's consideration at the next Board meeting.

Messrs. Brian Smith, Brett Hodgkiss, and Pat Houston left the meeting after this item. During the above discussion, Former Congressman Ron Packard, and Mr. Don Polese arrived. The following item was taken out of order to accommodate Mr. Packard and Mr. Polese's schedule.

16. CLOSED SESSION FOR CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL

President Williams adjourned the meeting to closed session at 9:19 a.m. for a conference with legal counsel to discuss the following pending litigation:

10. MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE ACTIVITIES OF THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

President Williams reported that a Colorado River Projects Committee meeting was scheduled for later in the month. He said that he had not yet seen an agenda published for this meeting. President Williams also reported that the labor agreement with Water Authority staff was approved, as was the purchase of workers' compensation insurance from Liberty Mutual. President Williams reported that the CWA Board approved the term sheet and directed staff to prepare a draft water purchase agreement with Poseidon Resources for desalinated seawater from the Carlsbad Desalination Project.

11. REPORTS ON MEETINGS AND EVENTS ATTENDED BY DIRECTORS, AND AUTHORIZATION FOR DIRECTOR ATTENDANCE AT UPCOMING MEETINGS AND EVENTS

See staff report attached hereto.

Director Dorey reported that he attended a meeting of the San Luis Rey Watershed Council (SLRWC) on July 26. At this meeting, a meeting of the SLRWC Board of Directors was planned for Friday, August 6 to discuss an ongoing issue concerning the authority of members of the Board to represent the official positions of the agencies they represent. Director Dorey reported that he also attended a meeting of the Upper San Luis Rey Watershed Authority on July 27, where a new member has joined the group from the Board of the Pauma Valley Community Services District.

Director MacKenzie reported that she attended the CSDA Fiscal Committee meeting where the Committee reviewed CSDA's current finances and set up a procedure and timeline for next year's budget. She also attended a San Diego Chapter CSDA Board meeting, where the teacher grant program was discussed. The program will continue, but the plan is to review and refine the criteria for next year. Director MacKenzie noted that elections would be coming up for the San Diego chapter in November 2010, and volunteers will be sought for the President, Vice-President, and Treasurer positions.

Director MacKenzie stated that she received authorization to attend the CSDA Quarterly meeting on August 19, 2010 in Kearny Mesa, but she would not be able to attend. She inquired if perhaps another Board member might be able to attend instead. Director Dorey stated that he would attend in Director MacKenzie's place.

Director Vásquez requested authorization to tentatively attend the Council of Water Utilities meeting on August 17. He said he would decide whether or not to attend after the agenda is received and he has a chance to review it. Director Dorey stated that he would like authorization to attend this meeting as well.

Director Miller requested authorization to attend the CSDA Annual Conference.

10-08-92 Upon motion by Director MacKenzie, seconded by Director Dorey and unanimously carried, the Board of Directors authorized the following attendances: Director Dorey to the CSDA Quarterly Dinner on August 19, 2010 in San Diego; Directors Dorey and Vásquez to the Council of Water Utilities Breakfast meeting on August 17, 2010 in Poway; Director Miller to the CSDA Annual Conference September 20-23, 2010 in Newport Beach.

12. ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS AND/OR PRESS RELEASES

13. DIRECTOR COMMENTS

Director Miller asked about the status of the grant for the Warner-Carrillo Ranch House Restoration Project. Mr. Coox responded that staff was currently finalizing all of the documentation needed for the State. He said he expected that the grant agreement would soon be received from the State, and he and General Counsel would review it. Mr. Coox stated that the plan was to bring this item as well as the maintenance plan for the Ranch House to the Board for consideration at the next Board meeting.

Director Miller asked about the status of the study to recommission the Shadowridge recycled water plant being performed by the City of Vista, jointly funded by VID along with a grant from the Water Authority. Mr. Coox responded that the study was on hold pending a larger study by the North County Recycled Water Group, which may reveal potential markets for the Shadowridge plant. The North County Recycled Water Group has grown to 11 agencies. The engineering group RMC Water and Environmental has been brought on board to do a regional feasibility study. Mr. Coox added that a kick-off meeting was scheduled for that afternoon, and Director of Engineering Brian Smith would be in attendance.

Director MacKenzie reported that the State Controller sent out a press release requesting that cities and counties provide him with all management personnel's salaries over \$100,000, so the information could be posted on the Controller's website. It is expected that the same information will be requested of special districts within the next two weeks. Director MacKenzie said that this is all due to the news story out of Bell, California concerning the exorbitant salaries of the City Manager and other management staff. Director MacKenzie spoke briefly about possible legislation that will come as a result of this case.

14. COMMENTS BY GENERAL COUNSEL

Mr. Kuperberg said that with regard to the State Controller's press release the previous day, the request included cities and counties, and not just public employees but elected officials as well. Mr. Kuperberg stated that he would expect to see this same request extended to special districts soon.

Mr. Kuperberg informed the Board that he received a phone call the previous week from a lawyer who represented a plaintiff in a private easement dispute in the vicinity of Majella Road in Vista. Mr. Kuperberg said that the lawyer contacted him because VID has a pipeline in the area, and it may either be exposed, or it may have lost some of its cover. The lawyer wanted VID to participate in mediation, even though the District is not part of the lawsuit. Mr. Kuperberg stated that he responded to the lawyer that he believed there to be no sense in the District getting involved at this juncture. Mr. Kuperberg said that he advised staff to monitor the situation, and he asked the lawyer to contact him when they get close to a resolution so the District can provide its requirements to maintain the appropriate cover and protection for that pipeline.

15. COMMENTS BY GENERAL MANAGER

Mr. Coox informed the Board that County Water Authority staff has informed VID staff that Metropolitan Water District (MWD) would be meeting on August 17 to consider the ramifications of the Water Authority's lawsuit regarding MWD's billing structure. In light of the lawsuit, MWD would be meeting to discuss the possibility of invoking clauses in contracts with the Water Authority which could cut off funding to certain Water Authority programs. Mr. Coox said that staff has concerns about implications for conservation program funding, which is received from the Water Authority, but originates from MWD. Mr. Coox said he would like to meet with the Water Conservation and Sustainability Committee sometime after the August 17 meeting to discuss if there are any funds left to move forward with VID's planned programs. Mr. Coox said staff would keep the Board posted on this situation as it develops.

Mr. Coox reminded the Board about the Annual VID Picnic on September 11, 2010 at Green Oak Ranch in Vista. He said he hoped to see the Board there.

SUBJECT: TREASURER'S REPORT AS OF JUNE 30, 2010

<u>SUMMARY</u>: Attached for review by the Board of Directors is the Treasurer's Report as of June 30, 2010. The report is formatted to provide information as required by the California Government Code and the Vista Irrigation District Investment Policy. The Treasurer's Report contains both an investment summary and a detailed security listing. Also attached is a five-year cash flow forecast, which indicates the District's investments are sufficiently liquid to meet anticipated cash flow needs.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: Activity for the quarter included deposits and withdrawals from the District's cash and cash equivalent accounts: checking, money market, California Asset Management Program (CAMP), and Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF). During the quarter \$3 million of Treasury bills matured and \$3 million of new Treasury bills were purchased.

As of June 30, 2010, the net unrealized gain on the portfolio was as follows:

All investment transactions have been made in accordance with the District's Investment Policy. Union Bank of California provides the market value information.

The Portfolio Interest Rate has continued to decrease due to the overall declining interest rate market. However, since the District has been transitioning its investment in 6-month Treasury bills into 1-year Treasury bills, the Weighted Average Maturity of the portfolio has increased as compared to the prior years.






FISCAL IMPACT: None.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: The owners have requested that a 7.5 foot portion of Specific Easement No. W49 be quitclaimed from their property located at 1800 University Drive in order for Wal-Mart to continue with their expansion project.

<u>DETAILED REPORT:</u> On July 21, 2010, Grant of Right of Way W61 was accepted by the District. The District has now secured the necessary easement width of 20 feet to be in compliance with VID Standard Easement Drawing 5-1. The 7.5 foot portion of easement via Grant of Right of Way W49 is no longer needed; therefore, it is recommended that this portion be quitclaimed.

SUBJECT: GRANT OF EASEMENT TO SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY (SDG&E)

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: That the Board grant an easement to SDG&E to construct, operate and maintain electrical and communication facilities on the Warner Ranch per the attached document.

PRIOR BOARD ACTION: None.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: This easement grants right-of-way to SDG&E for an existing 69 kV transmission line that has been in place on the Warner Ranch since about 1950. While improvements to this existing facility are contemplated, no new facilities or encumbrances are proposed.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: This easement across District lands begins near the junction of Highways 76 and 79 ("Moretti's Junction") and extends northward on the east side of Highway 79 to the existing SDG&E substation near the intersection with S-2 (San Felipe Road), as shown on the attached map (not a part of the easement). When SDG&E was compiling their proof of right-of-way for their application to the California Public Utilities Commission to replace the existing wood poles with steel poles along this transmission corridor, they could not locate a valid easement across District lands for this existing transmission line. The District was also unable to locate any such easement. SDG&E has requested that the attached easement document be executed to rectify this situation.

General Counsel has reviewed and approved the terms of this easement.

EASEMENT

VISTA IRRIGATION DISTRICT, (Grantor), grants to SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, a corporation (Grantee), a non-exclusive easement and right of way in, upon, over, under and across the lands hereinafter described, to erect, construct, change the size of, improve, reconstruct, relocate, repair, maintain and use facilities consisting of:

- Poles, wires, cables and appurtenances for the transmission and distribution of electricity.
- 2. Communication facilities, and appurtenances, for Grantee's use.

The above facilities are installed at such locations and elevations upon, along, over and under the hereinafter described easement as Grantee may now or hereafter deem convenient or necessary. Grantee also has the right of ingress and egress, to, from and along this easement in, upon, over and across the hereinafter described lands. Grantee further has the right, but not the duty to clear and keep this easement clear from explosives, buildings, structures and materials.

The property in which this easement and right of way is hereby granted is situated in the County of San Diego, State of California, described as follows:

That portion of Rancho Valle de San Jose, as per patent issued by the United States of America to Sylveste de la Portilla, January 10, 1880 in Book 2 of Patents, Page 84, Records of said County of San Diego, lying Easterly of California State Highway 79 (R.S. 490), as it exists on July 15, 2010.

The easement in the aforesaid lands is described in the Exhibit "A", consisting of one (1) page, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Grantor grants to Grantee the right to erect and maintain on Grantor's property adjacent to this easement such anchorage as may be necessary for Grantee's purposes.

Grantor shall not erect, place or construct, nor permit to be erected, placed or constructed, any building or other structure, plant any tree, drill or dig any well, within this easement.

Grantor shall not increase or decrease the ground surface elevations within this easement after installation of Grantee's facilities, without prior written consent of Grantee, which consent shall not unreasonably be withheld.

Grantee shall have the right but not the duty, to trim or remove trees and brush along or adjacent to this easement and remove roots from within this easement whenever Grantee deems it necessary. Said right shall not relieve Grantor of the duty as owner to trim or remove trees and brush to prevent danger or hazard to property or persons.

Grantee, its successors, assigns, agents or contractors, shall be responsible for any damage to Grantor's existing facilities occasioned by or arising from the construction, operation or maintenance of Grantee's facilities within said Grantor's property.

Grantee shall not use or store any materials on the Easement that are hazardous under local, state or federal law.

In its use of the Easement as described in this agreement, Grantee, at its sole cost and expense, shall promptly comply with all present and future laws, rules and regulations, including obtaining any necessary permits, of all government bodies or any other body exercising similar functions, foreseen or unforeseen, ordinary as well as extraordinary.

Grantor reserves unto itself, its successors and assigns, the right to use the subsurface, surface and airspace thereover, of the herein before described easement and right of way, for the installation of such facilities as it shall now or in the future deem necessary. Such rights shall not be exercised by Grantor, its successors or assigns, in such a manner as to be unreasonably incompatible with Grantee's installation.

Grantee shall at all times indemnify and save harmless Grantor against and pay in full any and all loss, damage or expense that Grantor may sustain, incur or become liable for, resulting in any manner from the construction, maintenance, use, state of repair or presence of Grantee's facilities installed hereunder and all necessary and proper fixtures and equipment for use in connection therewith, including any such loss, damage or expense arising out of the (a) loss or damage to property, and (b) injury to or death of persons, including the defense of any action arising therefrom.

Grantee covenants for itself, its successors and assigns that should Grantee discontinue use of this easement for the purposes set forth herein, then all rights granted in this easement shall terminate and Grantee, upon receipt of written request, shall execute and deliver to Grantor a good and sufficient Quitclaim Deed to all rights herein granted.

Grantor, its successors and assigns, shall not be required to bear any portion of the cost of construction, maintenance, alteration, repair, replacement, relocation or removal of Grantee's facilities installed within the easement herein granted.

Grantee understands and agrees that the Easement is being made available to it "as is," "where is" and "with all faults" without any representation or warranty by Grantor.

The legal description for this easement was prepared by San Diego Gas & Electric Company pursuant to Section 8730 of the Business and Professions Code, State of California.

This easement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of successors, heirs, executors, administrators, permittees, licensees, agents or assigns of Grantor and Grantee.





**SUBJECT:** VISTA FLUME REPLACEMENT PROJECT

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Update on the progress of the Vista Flume Replacement Project.

### **PRIOR BOARD ACTION:**

F/27/00

5/27/09	Approved the Final Design of the Vista Flume and Siphon Lining Pilot Project scope of work submitted by Kennedy/Jenks Consultants (K/J) and authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement for services for an amount not to exceed \$370,964.
11/4/09	Approved the Vista Flume and Siphon Lining Pilot Project and determined that the pilot project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act.
11/18/09	Authorized the General Manager to execute a Limited Notice to Proceed with K/J for a cost not to exceed \$155,000.
12/16/09	Authorized the General Manager to execute an Amendment to the Agreement for Services with Kennedy/Jenks Consultants for the design and implementation of a pilot study for the lining of a test section of the Vista Flume (MW Bench) at a cost not to exceed \$1,347,000.
6/16/10	Reviewed the draft Post-Construction Report for the Vista Flume and Lining Pilot Project and directed staff to begin preparation of a scope of work for the next phase of the Vista Flume Lining Project, including environmental considerations.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: The FY 2011 budget (Budget #08-03) includes \$1,200,000 for the next phase of the Vista Flume Replacement Project.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: As reported to the Board in June, the Vista Flume Pilot Project successfully inserted a 42" diameter HDPE pipe into the existing MW Bench flume structure. Given the success of the pilot project, the Board gave direction to staff to develop a strategy for the entire relining project, including environmental and cost considerations, and begin preparation of a scope of work for the next phase of the project.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: Staff, K/J and Legal Counsel have been discussing the project approach and environmental considerations necessary to undertake the project in light of the success of the pilot project. It appears that the project is exempt from CEQA based on two sections of the CEQA Guidelines (Class 1; §15301 and Class 2; §15302). These exemptions cover the repair, replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced.


Staff is evaluating the strategy for implementing the project, including the financing, environmental issues and the preferred procurement approach. With respect to environmental issues, staff and K/J will be


using preliminary habitat assessment, biological constraints and historic and archaeological resource surveys of the entire flume alignment that were conducted by sub-consultants to K/J as part of the Pilot Project Design scope of work, in order to avoid sensitive areas or schedule construction activities to avoid impacts to sensitive wildlife. This work effort will address construction level issues during design, with appropriate best management practices and/or additional features incorporated to ensure no significant, short- or long-term disturbance to sensitive resources or habitats occur within the flume's area of effect.

K/J is in the process of completing a draft scope of work for the design of the first phase of the project, which will include the three benches directly downstream of the Escondido/Vista Filtration Plant (Jack Creek, Big Tunnel and Tunnel Bench). Part of the design team will include an environmental consultant to ensure all necessary features are included in the design and bid documents to avoid potential constraints.

Staff anticipates the following actions will be requested from the Board at the next Board Meeting or a subsequent Board Meeting:

- 1) Approval of the Vista Flume Replacement Project as a capital improvement project of the District.
- 2) Determination that the project is exempt from CEQA and filing of a Notice of Exemption.
- 3) Selection of the preferred procurement alternative for construction of the first phase of the project.
- 4) Approval of a scope of work for the first phase of the project.

SUBJECT: CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE REVISIONS

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Adopt a resolution modifying the District's Conflict of Interest Code to eliminate two positions, revise the titles of 2 positions, add a Disclosure Category to one position, and combine Disclosure Categories 6 and 7 into one Category 6.

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION:

8/6/2008 Adopted Resolution No. 08-31 adopting an amended Conflict of Interest Code.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: Section 87306.5 of the Government Code requires all local agencies in California to review their conflict of interest code in each even-numbered year and file a statement with the County Board of Supervisors stating any revisions.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: The District's amended Conflict of Interest Code, as proposed, reflects the elimination of two positions: *Director of Facilities* and *Construction Manager*. It includes one new position: *Field Services Manager*. It also includes two revised job titles: *Water Resources Project Manager*, and *Water Resources Manager* Supervisor.

Upon review of the District's Disclosure Categories, it was noted that Categories 6 and 7 appear quite similar. It is proposed that these two categories be combined into one, thereby eliminating Category 7. Additionally, upon review of the job duties associated with each of the designated positions, it appears prudent to add Disclosure Category 2 to the Facilities Manager's disclosure categories due to that position's interaction with some of the lessees of the District.

These proposed revisions have been reviewed and endorsed by General Counsel.

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Conflict of Interest Code at the regular meeting on August 4, 2010, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Vista Irrigation District that the Board of Directors does hereby adopt the proposed amended Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be filed with the District Secretary and available for inspection to the public;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 08-31 adopting the Amended Conflict of Interest Code on August 6, 2008 is rescinded upon the adoption of said amended Code;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Conflict of Interest Code shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego for approval and said amended Code shall become effective 30 days after the Board of Supervisors approves the amended Code as submitted.

The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code. The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. Sec. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, the regulation may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act.

The Vista Irrigation District shall retain statements for all other designated employees. The Filing Officer will make all retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

For purposes of disclosure, the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and all District officials who manage the investment of public funds are governed by the statutory conflict of interest provisions of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Section 87200, et seq.)

The persons holding positions listed below are "designated employees" who are subject to the provisions of this Code. Each such designated employee is required to disclose interests only in those categories set forth, which are identified by the numbers following his or her title.

### **Disclosure Categories**

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of investments, business entities, sources of income, or real property that the designated employee must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.

- <u>Category 1</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, all business entities that do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District, plan to do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District within the next year or have done business or owned real property within the jurisdiction of the District within the past two years.

- <u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are banking, savings and loan or other financial institutions.
- <u>Category 6</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of a type purchased, or leased, used, or administered by the Designated Employee's Department or by the District.

<u>Category 7</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of a type used or administered by the Designated Employee's Department.
