GENERAL – The Prince Georges District Fall Cub Scout Camporee:

Where: Southern Maryland District American Legion Youth Camp in Cheltenham, Maryland,
9201 Surratts Road Cheltenham, MD 20623.

When: Friday, October 11 to Saturday October 12, 2013. (Over Night)

Registration will start at 1700 (5pm) Friday night to 2200 (10pm)

Day Program starts at 0900 (9am) and goes to 1700 (5pm)

Day Program Registration will start at 0700 (7am) and close at 1200 (noon)--If you register for overnight you do not need to re-register in morning!!

Event Theme: "Scouting Olympics."

Who: This is a Full District Event.. All Scouts From Tiger to Eagle are welcome.. You can register with your pack or individually. Siblings are welcome to attend as well.

- Tigers must have their adult partner with them the entire event.
- Wolves & Bears must have at least 1 adult for every 4 youth with a minimum of 2 adults per group (if individually registering, your scout must have an adult with them)
- Webelos can join a troop for the whole weekend or be with cubs for the one night.

REGISTRATION –This event requires an accurate count of participants in order to ensure adequate program material and food is available for the Saturday program.

Pre-Registration will be due no later than October 04, 2012.

ARRIVAL – Registration begins at 5:00 P.M. Each unit leader should report to the registration area after 5:00 P.M. with a completed unit Registration/Attendance form and a Medical Information form properly filled out for each person attending. Total fees, less any deposit, will be collected at this time.-- Fees cover required insurance, program material, patches and incidental costs. Checks or Money Orders should be made out to "BSA, NCAC".

This Camporee is expected to be a very physical Camporee,

Scouts will be running, and will be showing team work and team spirit at stations, as well

as displaying Scout Skills at almost all stations.

MEDICAL INFORMATION FORMS – Each adult and youth member attending the Camporee must provide a properly filled out Medical Information form when registering. An approved copy of the form can be found on the Council website. Units may duplicate the form locally.

Forms will be returned at the conclusion of the Camporee. Unit leaders should ensure the medical information provided is accurate and that attendees have any required medication and/or equipment with them. There have been incidents where information pertaining to a condition such as asthma is not listed on the Medical Information form and the attendee is not prepared to deal with an attack.

VEHICLES – VEHICLES MAY NOT ENTER THE CAMPGROUND AREA AT ANY

TIME! Vehicles will park in designated area and ALL equipment must be carried to campsite.

There will be NO exceptions.

PROHIBITED – The Boy Scouts of America and/or District Program Committee strictly prohibit the following items or activity. Violation may cause ejection from the event.

- Alcohol
- Illegal Drugs
- Firearms
- Laser Pointers
- Liquid Fire Starter
- Sheath Knives
- Fireworks
- Double-bladed axes
- Cutting or breaking live trees or shrubs
- Entering another campsite without permission
- Vandalism

· Playing any Football other than Flag Football

ADULT LEADERS ARE TO ENSURE ALL YOUTH MEMBERS ARE PROPERLY SUPERVISED AT ALL TIMES!

CRACKER BARREL – There will be an ADULT leader cracker barrel on Friday. At least one adult leader from each Unit should be present to obtain pertinent information.

GROUND FIRES ARE NOT PERMITTED – Fires contained completely above the ground will be permitted. **FIRES MUST BE ATTENDED AT ALL TIMES!**

WATER – Units are to provide unbreakable containers to transport water from water source to their campsite. The water source is not to be used for any other purpose, such as washing up, brushing teeth, cleaning cooking/eating equipment, filling personal drink containers, playing, etc. Adult and boy leaders are responsible for maintaining discipline at the water source! Rule violations may mean dismissal from the Camporee.

LOST AND FOUND – Items found should be turned in at the Headquarters area. Items may be claimed during the Camporee or at subsequent Roundtables.

SANITATION – Indoor male and female bathroom facilities will be available in the bath house and are for Adults Only. Youth will have Porta-potties for the Camporee.

TRASH – All trash must be placed in appropriate containers and removed from the Camporee site at the conclusion of the Camporee. **DO NOT PLACE ANYTHING IN THE DUMPSTER!**

FIRST AID – A First Aid station will be staffed at all times during the Camporee. All injuries should be brought to the attention of the First Aid staff in order to evaluate, treat and log the incident. If a victim cannot be moved, two (2) runners should be dispatched to the First Aid station to summon assistance. The runners must be able to quickly and calmly describe the location and nature of the emergency in order to dispatch proper medical personnel and equipment.

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT – To fully experience the great outdoors and acquire necessary Scouting skills, youth members must leave the domestic home environment behind. In this regard, electronic equipment used for entertainment purposes is not appropriate at Boy Scout outings. This includes Radio and Television receivers, Tape or CD players and all electronic games. Unit electronic equipment in support of health and safety, such as a Radio or Scanner used to monitor weather information, Amateur/CB Radio communication capability or Cellular Telephones, is permitted by adults only.

Family Radio Service (FRS) transceivers tuned to channel seven (7) are used by event staff for communication. Event participants are not permitted to transmit on this channel at any time.
