The relationship among the Great Powers was *poor*. From the source, *France wanted to attack Germany with a weapon*.

2. Which two Powers would be the enemies in the early 20th century? Explain your answer, with reference to the source, or based on the dialogue on p.4 to p.5 of your textbook,

France and Germany would be enemies in the early 20th century. It is because French defeat in the Franco-Prussian War was a painful humiliation. She wanted to take revenge on Germany.
