A. GOALS OF THE COURSE:

1. To properly install and maintain plants in the landscape.
2. To understand to use and subsequent care required for plants in the landscape.
3. To become professional in the field.

B. OBJECTIVES:

1. Read and interpret landscape blueprints.
2. Maintain residential, commercial, and recreational area landscapes.
3. Maintain plants for their function.
4. Implement appropriate erosion control methods.
5. Schedule maintenance crews.

C. METHOD OF GRADING:

1. Two exams will be given worth 100 points each.
2. Ten quizzes will be given worth 10 points each.
3. Letter grades will be assigned as follows:
