cterior	Cooking Watch What
Make house number visible from street.	☐ Never leave cooking unattended.
Trim trees away from electrical wires.	Cuff sleeves and turn pot handles inward when cooking to avoid burn injuries.
Trim trees away from chimney and remove all pine needles and leaves from roofs, eaves and rain gutters.	Never store combustibles in over or on top of stove.
Never attempt to trim trees near power lines. For more information contact:	When barbecuing, move unit away from the house.

eating Equipment & Fireplace	Smoking Materials & Candles
Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from all combustibles.	Never leave cigarettes or candles unattended.
Replace furnace filters one a year.	Purchase and use ashtrays that have the center support feature.
Clean lint from behind clothes dryer.	Empty ashtrays into noncombustible containers only.
Install a spark screen in front of the fireplace.	☐ Never smoke in bed.
] Have chimney inspected and cleaned annually.	Place candles in noncombustible, sturdy holders.
] Install a spark arrester on chimney	Keep matches and lighters out of reach of children.
Dispose of ashes in metal containers.	Carbon Monoxide / Smoke Alarms
Keep newspapers, other combustibles and clutter away from water heater.	Install smoke alarms inside and outside every sleeping area and on every level of your home.
ectrical	Install carbon monoxide alarms in a central
Avoid overloading electrical circuits.	<ul><li>location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.</li></ul>
Inspect electrical cords and appliances for damage.	Test carbon monoxide/smoke alarms once a month.  Hint: use a broom handle to reach & push test button.
Do not tack cords to the wall or run them under rugs.	Replace carbon monoxide/smoke alarm batteries once a year.
Maintain air space around electrical equipment, such as, TV, VCR, stereo, etc.	<ul><li>Hint: use Daylight Savings time as a reminder.</li><li>Replace carbon monoxide/smoke alarm units every 10 years.</li></ul>
