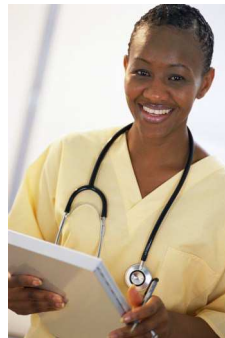
The Met PALS program (Metropolitan Hospital Center Preparation for Achievement in the Life Sciences) is a four-week career exploration program for high school juniors and seniors, open to students who attend or reside in the surrounding Metropolitan Hospital area. Metropolitan Hospital not only serves the health needs of the area but provides opportunities for experience and training for those in the community who are interested in pursuing careers in the health care field. The program is designed to give these students hands-on experience and help them in the college admissions process.

The program is under the auspices of Metropolitan Hospital Center Volunteer Services and the New York Medical College Dean's Office. Students will assist and interact with doctors and nurses, and other professional staff in various departments, such as Radiology, Central Sterile Supply, Pathology, and Pharmacy. They will have the opportunity to observe first hand, the role these vital services play in providing care, and to attend classes and presentations by the professional staff of the hospital. Mindful of their educational goals, the program includes SAT preparation from New York Medical College students, along with an opportunity to and go on field trips to round out their experience.

Met PALS Alumni from previous years have credited their success in gaining admission to the colleges of their choice through participation in Met PALS. Several students are currently enrolled in prestigious institutions, such as the University of Pennsylvania, Colgate, Syracuse and the CUNY honors program.

Students must have passing grades for all high school courses and will require recommendations of two teachers to be accepted in the program. Students employed in the Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) or enrolled in summer school are ineligible to participate. The program meets Tuesdays through Fridays at Metropolitan Hospital Center from 9:00 AM-3:00 PM during July and August. Lunch vouchers are provided.

Interview

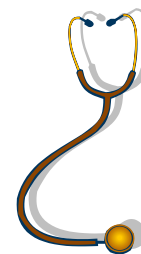
Once the application has been received interviews will be scheduled. Parental consent is required for participation in the program and all students must provide a social security number. Two references letters from teachers.
