Please join the Transferware Collectors Club for our thirteenth annual meeting held this year in Seattle at the historic Mayflower Park Hotel.

Activities

Friday includes a monorail ride to the new Chihuly Garden and Glass House, a tour of Flora Rabinovitch's magnificent collection, and a visit to the Seattle Art Museum. Flora's collection is extensive with many unusual shapes, and is just as intriguing for the artistic way she has displayed it. Saturday night's dinner includes tours of Marcia and Klaus Zech's collections of both blue and

white transferware and Mason's Ironstone, with an emphasis on botanical themes. They also collect antique botanical prints.

All presentations will be on Thursday evening, Saturday all day and Sunday morning.

Optional Day: Thursday, Oct. 18

We depart the historic Mayflower Park Hotel for Suzanne and John Price's home to view their collection and for rolls and coffee. The Price's have some lovely Chinoiserie, ironstone, and a collection of portrait jugs. Then we will head for the ferry to Whidbey Island where we will have lunch at Marcia and Klaus Zech's beach home and view part of their collection. They have blue and white in botanical themes, animal themes, as well as some ironstone. On the way back we will spend a short time in picturesque Langley and then take the ferry and head back to the hotel in time for the opening reception. *Cost for this day is \$55 per person*.

Special Excursion to Victoria, BC October 16 – 17, 2012

You are invited to join this special premeeting excursion to beautiful Victoria!

Excursion Itinerary

Join us on an overnight excursion from Seattle, Washington to Victoria, British Columbia, Canada, departing Seattle early on Tuesday,



October 16th and returning on Wednesday evening October 17th. We will travel on the high speed catamaran, the **Victoria Clipper**, to and from Victoria. Upon

arrival we will board a bus for a tour of the city

and transport to the world famous **Butchart Gardens** where we will have two hours to visit the garden. High Tea is available there at your option. Then we will return to Victoria and



check into our hotel, the **Grand Pacific Hotel**. That evening we are invited to a reception hosted by the **Victoria Ceramics Circle** at Leonard Clarke's **Pacific Antiques** shop. Afterwards we will go to a local pub for a no-host meal.

On Wednesday, we will tour the Native Peoples Exhibit

at the **Royal British Columbia Provincial Museum**. This is a fabulous museum and is particularly known for this exhibit. The museum has an excellent gift shop. Thunderbird Park borders the museum and has a small col-

lection of totem poles, which weather permitting, we will walk through.



The afternoon is free time. Some of you may want to visit the Art Gallery of Greater Victoria, which is

very nice. Another option is to take **Northwest Afternoon Tea at the Grand Pacific Hotel**. Or do both. Others may want to shop or explore downtown Victoria and Bastion Square. We will gather at the pier at 4:30 where we will clear Immigration and board the Clipper at 5pm. It departs at 6 pm, arriving in Seattle at 8:45pm.

If you decide to join us, you will probably need to arrange for two extra nights at the

Mayflower Park Hotel:

Monday night and Wednesday night. I have alerted them that we may have some members needing these shoulder
