State Fair Animal Exhibitors!

Junior exhibitors now submit ALL entry information and fees DIRECTLY to state fair. County UWEX Offices are no longer involved in the entry process. Junior exhibitors must be a member in good standing with an approved youth organization (see list at www.wistatefair.com) and be enrolled by March 1 of the current year to be eligible to participate in State Fair youth programs.

Junior Show Entry Deadlines will be:

June 4th for those entering by mail and paying by check or money order.

June 18th for those entering online and paying with a credit or debit card.

After June 18th, State Fair will verify participant eligibility with 4-H, FFA, Breed Org. etc. State Fair lodging will be available on a first come/first serve basis to youth participating.

Entries Due: March 7th, no changes after March 12th.

Rules for Speaking are as follows:

- 1. Each 4-H member must develop his/her own original speech for the current year (ie: may not use a previous year's 4-H speech but may adapt a speech given at a school or organizational event).
- 2. Only prop allowed will be 3x5" cards for notes.
- 3. Speech will be judged with an emphasis on delivery.
- 4. Speeches may be on any topic.

Regulations for Storytelling

- 1. Storyteller must sit in a chair.
- 2. Costumes and props are not permitted.
- 3. Entrants can select their own topic area. Introductions should include the title of the story and where their idea came from.
- 4. Story must be memorized.

The story must be original (written by storyteller) and can be true or make-believe. Contestants will be judged on originality, voice, stage presence, and general effect.

Demonstrations & Illustrated Talks

The contest will be for younger and older members with individual and team demonstrations and illustrated talks. 4-H'ers may give a demonstration on any subject - they need not be limited to enrolled projects

<u>Illustrated Talks</u> - this is the category for all youth giving a talk with aid of posters instead of actual demonstrations

Team Demonstrations – will be entered according to the grade of the oldest demonstrator.

Special Demonstration Awards

Up to two demos from youth in grades 9 and up and receiving a blue ribbon, may be nominated for participation in the State Fair program. Those who have not gone to State Fair will have preference over those who have gone.

Equipment

All contestants must bring their own equipment and supplies to the contest. Stands for the member's charts will be furnished by the UW-Extension Office, as well as extension cords, if staff is notified of need. Live animals are not allowed in the courthouse; however, animal demonstrations have been done outside on the lawn, so plan accordingly.



For Your Information: Parliamentary Procedure – How to Make a Motion

Stand and address the officer by saying "Mr. President". The President will recognize you by saying your name. This gives you permission to speak. Make your motion by saying, "I move that (state your motion)." An example might be "I move that we participate in a canned food drive at our November meeting. Someone else seconds the motion by saying, "I second the motion", meaning that they think your motion is a good idea.

The president says "A motion has been made by (name) and seconded by (name) to participate in a canned food drive at our November meeting. Is there any discussion?" This is the chance for any member to give their opinion of the motion. They need to be recognized by the president before speaking.

When discussion stops, the chairman says, "If there is no further discussion, we will vote on the motion. All in favor say 'aye'." Members vote. "All apposed, say 'nay'." Members vote. The president then announces the results of the vote saying, "The ayes (or nays) have it". The motion to participate in a canned food drive at our November club meeting is carried (or fails)." If the chairman is not sure which side had the most voice votes, he may ask for a show of hands.

That's all that's to it. If all members know how to make a motion, your meetings will run much more smoothly.
