

CLIFTON KNOLLS/MILL CREEK PARK DISTRICT ADVISORY COMMITTEE UPDATE

Once again, the Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Park District Advisory Committee would like to update our community on the various changes and upgrades that were accomplished over the 2011 season.

The results of the survey that was sent out in September are still on hold and will be described in a later News and Views. A mailing snafu has necessitated remailing the survey to addresses that were overlooked by the post office in the initial mailing. When we receive and tally the additional surveys, the report will be issued.

A request by the Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Civic Association resulted in an update on the Clifton Park.org site. (Go to Town Hall and under Town Departments click on "Park, Recreation and Community Affairs". A listing of Park District Advisory Committees is reached by clicking "Parks" in the left column then "Park District Advisory Committee" on the right near the top.) Also, the CKMCCA has included the park committee in its email distribution list. Interested community members are invited to attend any park district meetings which are held on the fourth Tuesday of most months in Room B of Town Hall at 7p.m. (On the Cliftonpark.org website click on the Community Calendar Icon at the top of the page, then click on the fourth Tuesday of that month for any changes.)

This was a productive year for the completion of several landscaping projects. The shoulders of Par Del Rio and lower Broadleaf were raked, smoothed and seeded. An area west of the deck on Valencia was installed with a new bench, shrubs and some bollards as an attractive way to inhibit vehicular traffic on the grass. The shrubs in the area surrounding the Mill Creek Entrance sign at Brookwood and Orchard Park Drive were trimmed and mulched with some perennials added. And on the other end of the development, trees and shrubs have been planted on the berm between the parking area next to the basketball courts. Behind the tennis courts, the scrub brush and Locust trees were removed. (The Locust trees are considered "junk" trees because limbs splinter off randomly and leaves fall on and ruin the tennis court surface. Hurricane Irene demonstrated the danger that this grove posed because several large, main branches were ripped from four or five mature locust trees.) The area was filled in and leveled. In the spring, shorter shrubs and trees will be planted to beautify the area and the grounds will be seeded. The perennial gardens throughout the parklands continue to be maintained. Mums were planted in the fall. It was gratifying to see residents taking photos of the beautiful chrysanthemums in our park.

Other improvements in response to neighbors' requests include, refurbishing of the volleyball courts and nets on Locust LaneField; clearing out of old tree trunks, dead trees, brush and vines in the area of the Upper Beechwood Pond and on Belmonte Lane behind the post and three rail fence; and resurfacing of the tennis courts with the addition of pickleball lines on one court. (Pickleball is a sport which is fast becoming a favorite with many residents. It is a combination of ping pong and tennis. Check it out *Continued on next page...*

on Google to see if you might like to learn to play. There is a very active pickleball contingent all year long at the YMCA .) Another improvement is the rebuilding of the tennis court backboard, to be completed and painted in the spring.

Other repairs and additions to our parklands included two more benches: one on the Par Del Rio pathway and another near the newly created parking area west of the basketball court. The pathways around all the ponds were remulched by our faithful young summer help, Darrin, to keep them as dry and walkable as possible. A new bike rack will be installed on Locust Lane to replace the damaged one.

As the cold weather settles in, watch for a new ice rink to be set up on Locust Lane Field instead of on the basketball court. This is the committee's attempt to test if the ice will remain longer on a bed of snow on the field rather than melting quickly on the black surface of the basketball court.

A big Thank You goes to those who faithfully watered the planters on the Beechwood and Grooms/Barney Entrance Markers: Jean Teal, Doreen Croteau, Claudia Hroncich, and Sheila Suozzo.

Also, a big thank you to Keri and Lee Horton for their care of the plantings at the Beechwood Entrance Marker and to Nancy and Bill Connor who beautify the marker at Vischer Ferry Road and Greenlea with seasonal attractions and Miguel and Yocasta Favian for their mowing of the area around the marker at Grooms and S.Barney. Also special thanks go to Mike Blais and Pam Stafford who care for the Moe and Par Del Rio marker. Our paid landscapers, Cliffsides Landscaping and A-Z Property Management also did a very good job in maintaining the trees, shrubs and perennials throughout the seasons.

And lastly, the committee continues to look for answers to the problem of maintenance of our three ponds. We have some engineering studies regarding different alternatives. At the moment, the most cost effective process seems to be our continuing application of algaecide each year and herbicide every three years. This is always done with DEC approvals. We also have herb eating fish in the ponds which are added as the older fish die off. The abundant rains this year seem to have helped to keep the ponds looking at their best. The deeper the water, the more difficult it is for the sun to warm the nutrients which encourage more vegetation.

The committee would like to thank our Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek community for another very supportive year. We greatly appreciate the thanks and positive comments we receive throughout the season. You can reach us with any concerns through ckmcparkdistrict@ckmcca.org.

Call For Applications: CKMCCA Annual Scholarship Award 2012

Your annual dues to the Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Civic Association helps our neighborhoods have the children's Halloween party, have the adult wine and cheese party, maintain our neighborhood entrance markers, and publish this newsletter and our annual directory. For the past several years, it has also granted a scholarship to a different deserving neighborhood student each year.

The CKMCCA is again offering a \$500.00 scholarship award to recognize an outstanding high school senior who shows academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and involvement in the community. Besides showing these characteristics, the other requirements are that the student must live in the Clifton Knolls or Mill Creek neighborhoods, and their family must be dues-paying members of the Civic Association. Students are eligible regardless of the school that they attend, or even if they're homeschooled.

To apply for the scholarship, high school seniors are required to submit a letter describing their qualifications and interest in receiving the scholarship. Because the scholarship is awarded based on academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and civic involvement, it would be wise to include this information in the letter. A copy of the student's most recent high school transcript is also required. Other information, such as letters of recommendation, could prove helpful in the selection process, but are not required.

Applications are evaluated and ranked by a group of business, governmental, and academic leaders in the Capital District. They are not members of the Civic Association, to ensure their impartiality.

Thanks for your cooperation—e-mail really is the quickest way to get messages out these days.
