One of the big trends in real estate sales in recent years has been the "staging" of a home to make it look its best for prospective buyers.

The principles of staging can be applied to our homes in the Knolls and Mill Creek whether or not you are planning to sell this year or many years in the future. I suggest this because generally the approaches that make a home more saleable also make it more liveable.

A key strategy in staging is simply that the process of artfully arranging the inside of your home shows off your home's full potential. Staging plays up your home's good features, such as enhancing a great view or drawing the

buyer's eye to some spectacular wood floors. It is clear to see how that applies in our neighborhood with our mature trees, lovely lots, hardwood floors and spacious rooms.

Another strategy of staging is to minimize some of the home's drawbacks, such as

making a small bedroom look larger. Give away or donate overly large pieces of furniture that are too big for a room

You cannot use staging to conceal structural defects, such as hanging a picture over a crack in the wall.

In many of our homes, the major drawback is age. Many of our homes are more than 40 years old. Don't let them look their age.

Unless you are planning to sell in the near future, you should be "staging" your home for your own benefit and enjoyment. Staging a home means it will "live better" as well as look better.


That means "de-cluttering" a room. No one wants to see several days' worth of mail and newspapers on the kitchen counter, or a kid's

bedroom crammed with toys and games. That may mean the installation of new shelves in a closet so there is a place for a child's toys or clearing out a kitchen cabinet so you can move the food processor off the counter.

The same applies to the garage, basement and even the backyard storage shed where some new shelving and/or some organization can make the space more inviting and more useable.

This same perspective can be applied to all the other jobs associated with home ownership.

Outside the home: Take a hard look at those foundation shrubs – would they benefit from a severe trimming or replacement? Shrubs need to be constantly groomed and trimmed. If yours haven't been groomed for a long time,



they may be overgrown and need to be replaced. Make this the year to take care of that project. It will do wonders for the house—and for you every time you drive up to your house. The driveway and walkways – do they need repairing or is it time to replace them? Painting – have you been diligent

about painting the trim on one side of your house each year?

Inside your home: Look at your home like a stranger, or a prospective buyer would see it. Is it time to strip off the flocked wallpaper in favor of fresh paint in the modern colors and tones? Is there too much furniture in the family room or living room or fixtures that are worn or outof-date? Is it time to pull up those worn carpets and refinish the hardwood?

All of these steps are the things a stager might consider to make your home more saleable. You should consider the same approach to make your home more livable.





The News & Views gets published five times a year. Often times, there are things that arise between publication dates, and more and more, e-mail is the best way to get quick messages out. The Civic Association has an e-mail distribution list of about 300, but most of those are from individuals who have paid their Civic Association Dues. As paying dues is optional—but highly encouraged!—we don't get e-mail addresses from most of the approximately 900 homes in Clifton Knolls and Mill Creek.

In the past, we've used it to alert residents about power and flooding issues, send a headstart on leaf pickup, as well as reminders on neighborhood events. If you would like to be put on the e-mail distribution list, please send an e-mail to mailinglist@ckmcca.org.

Be assured that your e-mail will not be used for commercial purposes or spam, and when neighborhood-wide messages go out, all e-mail addresses are hidden, so people won't be able to get everyone's e-mail addresses. Thanks for your cooperation—e-mail really is the quickest way to get messages out these days.

POOL LOT STRIPING

Based on requests at the annual meeting, the CKMCCA Board contacted the Town to inquire if plans are in the works to repaye and/or repaint parking lot lines in the pool parking lots. At present, there are no plans, but the issue has now been brought to the Town's attention.

CKMCCA MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASE

As you'll notice with the membership forms in this issue, we have increased Civic Association Membership dues by \$2 to \$20. This is to cover increased printing and mailing costs for the News and Views, and is also necessary as membership has been down in recent years. Currently, approximately one quarter of the homes in the neighborhood are 10 CKMCCA members.



Golf Course Sale Status

In mid-June, CKMCCA organized a meeting with residents, Town Planner Scavo, and Town Supervisor Barrett. As it stands, the current owners no longer want to own the Barney Road golf course and they are also interested in selling the garage and the office building. The Town of Clifton Park is very interested in buying the golf course portion of the property and establishing a Town golf course. It already owns some of the land surrounding the golf course, which is managed by the Park District. At this point, there is no proposal for development on the land and the current owners would like to sell it to the Town if price is fair. Having gone through a bid process, the Town selected an appraiser at last town board meeting. It will take approximately 6 weeks to get an appraisal report back to the Town board before they can even begin any negotiations with the current owners. In order to determine the value of the property, it needs to be appraised as a golf course and as property to develop as residential. Given the wet lands and not knowing the water table they cannot determine at this time how many homes could be built there. The Town is checking to see if there any prior rulings concerning the potential to develop this property, but have found nothing to date. The property is currently zoned residential. If the Town were to purchase the land it would be zoned as public recreation/institutional space. It was noted that if the property is not sold, there is nothing to force the current owner to maintain it and it could become overgrown and abandoned. CKMCCA will be actively working to encourage the Town to maintain its status as a golf course in our neighborhood, and have written a letter in support of the Town's purchasing it.



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
