Use Trail 1 and Trail 8 only. Nothing should be documented under your new incident #.

New Incident Number is entered on Trail 1– Incident Info. in the **Connect Up No**. field

Remember to change Dictation type to 2 and Priority to 3

Put the **ORIGINIAL** incident number in the SUBJECT line when you email your report

Clear your new call # on the MDC (or radio) using 49.00 & O (Oscar)

...Unless you are doing a supplement. Then you can use 'O' to clear you newly assigned call provided your prepare the supplement report.

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Narrative Grammar Guide

- 1. Write in the first person, e.g., "We (I) interviewed..." or "We (I) examined the broken door and discovered..."
- 2. Use the active voice, e.g., Ms. Brown discovered the rear kitchen window was broken. NOT: *The rear kitchen window was discovered to be broken by Ms. Brown.*
- 3. Avoid pronouns as much as possible, e.g., We (I) is OK. "Ms. Brown said…", NOT "She said…"
- 4. Spell out all abbreviations, e.g., Mr./Ms. are OK. Bank of America NOT *B of A.* Department of Transportation NOT *DOT.* Green Valley, NOT *GV.*
- 5. Do not use contractions. 'Do not' instead of 'don't' and 'ls not' instead of 'isn't'.
- 6. Do not capitalize the type of call, e.g., 'larceny' not 'Larceny'

Typing shortcuts that can used in reports

Type: wwda[spacebar] =text displayed: We were dispatched at

Type: **vrfi[spacebar]** = *text displayed:* Victim's Rights Form was issued.

Type: gv[spacebar] =text displayed: Green Valley

NOTE: When doing practice reports the incident # is always "YYMMDD000". Put **PRACTICE REPORT** in the first line in the narrative and the subject line of the email.

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FOUND PROPERTY/EVIDENCE CHECKLIST

- 1. Packaging:
 - a. Red evidence tape must be applied to all openings.
- b. Use black Sharpie pen to write your name, badge#, and date across the tape.
- 2. The Evidence Control Form and the evidence tag must agree.
 - a. Incident number
 - b. Item # and description
 - c. Date and/or time
 - d. Your name and badge#
 - e. UCR code (5203 for found property) (do not use 4900)

3. Evidence item numbers are your initials and a number, ex: MH1, MH2, MH3.


- 4. Continue the item numbers on the evidence envelope/tag as needed.
- 5. <u>Cash, weapons, ammo, and knives must be packaged separately.</u>
- 6. Knives and sharp items are boxed/wrapped to make them safe. Guns are MADE SAFE and secured. Holsters, magazines and ammo must be packaged separately.
- 7. List the owner as **UNKNOWN**, if that is the case
- 8. Special Instructions section:
 - a. If evidence is to be destroyed, use form 1330.
 - b. Write SAFEKEEPING <u>only</u> if owner's name and address are known
- 9. Money is <u>itemized</u> by denomination and the <u>total listed</u> on the Evidence Control Form and on the evidence package.
- 10. **TYPE** check one only: **Evidence**, **Found Property**, **Safekeeping (see 8b)**.
- 11. Put the pink copy of the Evidence Control Form in the labeled container. Put the Evidence Control Form (white and blue copy) in locker 001. Do not put it in the same envelope as the evidence. Gold copy is attached to your report for our files.
- 12. The evidence can also go in locker 001 if it fits.
- 13. See the example in the Report Manual.

- 1. With radio ON
- 2. Push green [BUTTON] under ZONE





- 3. Use scroll pad, highlight **SAV-TRNG** then
- 4. Push green [BUTTON] under SEL
- 5. Turn channel selector knob to position 2 or 11 (your display should look like one of theseP





TO PROGRAM MS1 & MS2 BUTTONS

- 1. Select channel you wish to program to two **green** dot button
- 2. Press two **green** dot [button] under MS1 until radio "beeps".
- 1. Select channel you wish to program to three **green** dot button
- 2. Press three **green** dot [button] under MS1 until radio "beeps".

Accidental EMERGENCY BUTTON activation

"Code 20 Echo" will be initiated by the dispatcher

Your radio will have an orange band with the word "EMERGENCY" across display







Answer "Code 4" if all is OK.

After the dispatcher has acknowledged your trip, you clear (exit) the emergency mode with a press and hold of the preprogrammed Emergency Button

F. The Remote Patrol will keep COMM and the District Deputies advised of their activities by using the following example radio procedure.

Patrol: Golf 13 (or other designator)

COMM: Golf 13

Patrol: Code 9 at [GIVE THE AREA YOU ARE ENTERING],

Negative code 20s

COMM: (time)

----(at end of neighborhood patrol) ------

Patrol: Golf 13 COMM: Golf 13 Patrol: 10-8 COMM: (time)

Repeat the above for each neighborhood. You can use the MDC to indicate you are 10-8 after the last Remote Patrol.

G. If COMM asks for your 10-20:

Sahuarita Highlands is Santa Rita Rd & Broadwater Way

Entrada is Sahuarita Rd & Mann Ave.

Curly Horn is Helmet Peak and Avenida Cinco Montana Vista is Calle Tres & Montana Vista

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
