Dear Parents,

Yesterday we gathered as a school community in the Marian Centre where we participated in a Liturgy to celebrate the beginning of the Church's season of Lent. Mr. Anderson and our Senior school students led us in this liturgy. Lent leads up to the season of Easter, the most important time in the Church's calendar where we remember Jesus' death and resurrection. Jesus brought the promise of hope for all so that we may *"Have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10)* 

During Lent we are called to pray, fast and give to those who are less fortunate than us and as we do this we are reminded of Jesus. During this season of Lent each classroom has a Project Compassion box and the children will hear about the work of Caritas Australia. Project Compassion is an annual fundraiser for Caritas Australia. Our Senior School students have prepared their own Lenten Reflections which are displayed in their classrooms. #### NET SET GO

All 5-10 year olds (except those participating in 11/Under competitions) will need to be registered as a NetSetGO member (\$45) and will receive a NetSetGO participant pack (valued at \$50).

In 2014 the ANZ NetSetGO Program is divided into two distinct tiers:

Tier 1: "NET" - Skills program (5 – 7 years / beginner netballers)

NetSetGO for 5-7 years is a play based movement skills program. Emphasis is on the acquisition of basic movement skills, in a fun environment consisting of games and activities. Children join the program as individuals, not as teams and the focus is on participation and developing skills. This program will run on Thursday afternoons 4 - 5pm at Nets Stadium beginning Feb 13th - 5th June.

Tier 2: "NET SET GO" - Skills and Competition (name replaces all modified competitions in existence ie. Netta Under 9, will now be "NetSetGo 9/u" or "NetSetGo 9/u Res")

NetSetGo is for 8 - 10 year olds is an introduction to the sport of netball and incorporates modified matches and equipment.

It is a skill and competition based program that all children should participate in prior to entering junior competitions.

The rules and equipment for NetSetGO competition have been designed to align the game with the psychological and physical capabilities of young children. The NetSetGO competition rules (attached) will replace the Netta competition rules.

These rules have been recommended by Netball Australia for the 8-10 year old age group, and supported by Netball Victoria competitions within this age range.
